CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 23, 1923.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended November 23rd, 1923, shows a net increase of 6,852,209 bushels in the quantity of grain in store over the previous week. The stocks for the week amounted to Wheat 103,716,757 bushels; Oats 16,231,130 bushels; Barley 4,955,515 bushels; Flax 2,225,234 bushels; Rye 4,157,950 bushels; a total of 131,286,596 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 4,763,286 bushels; Oats 1,568,032 bushels; Barley 467,035 bushels; Flax 77,104 bushels, while Rye showed a decrease of 43,248 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in all grains in store of 2,797,724 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat, Oats and Rye of 2,057,171; 740,315; and 36,043 bushels respectively while the decreases were shown in Barley of 6,662 bushels and Flax 29,083 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on November 16th, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week also the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW & CALGARY). A net decrease is shown in all grains of 8,494 bushels. The decreases were shown in Wheat of 4,333 bushels; Oats 3,938 bushels and Rye 399 bushels, while a single increase is shown in Barley of 175 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. All grains in store show a net decrease of 47,599 bushels. Wheat showed a large decrease of 48,803 bushels; Oats and Rye showed small increases, 42 and 1,167 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR. The stocks in store show a net increase of 2,416,860 bushels. Wheat showed an increase of 5,285,795 bushels and Flax 62,179 bushels. Decreases took place in Oats of 524,482 bushels; Barley 61,474 bushels and Rye 316,152 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A single decrease is shown in Wheat of 15,193 bushels while an increase is noted in Oats of 33,324 bushels making a net increase of 18,151 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The total grain in store showed a net increase of 275,460 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 793,386 bushels and Rye 28,110 bushels, while Oats, Barley and Flax showed increases of 697,325 bushels; 376,123 bushels and 24,008 bushels respectively.

6,851,893 bushels and 440,193 bushels of Wheat were received by Vessel and Rail respectively at the above elevators for the past week. The Vessel Receipts were as follows: Georgian Bay Ports 3,817,743 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 1,811,736 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,222,414 bushels. 440,193 bushels were received by Rail at St. Lawrence Ports (Montreal and Quebec).

The total grain Receipts amounted to 9,393,109 bushels and 601,608 bushels by Vessel and Rail respectively. Georgian Bay Ports received 5,505,748 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 2,361,021 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,526,340 bushels; all by Vessel while 601,608 bushels were received by Rail at St. Lawrence Ports.

U.S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The quantity in store was 3,116,576 bushels compared with 6,488,647 bushels for the previous year. A decrease of 3,372,071 bushels. As stated in the previous weeks the bulk of this grain is held in the elevators at Montreal and Quebec, the amount being 1,890,044 bushels while the remainder in store at the Georgian Bay Ports amounts to 1,226,532 bushels. Of the 6,488,647 bushels in store last year Georgian Bay Ports had 3,790,804 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 2,04,012 bushels; Seaboard Ports 50,429 bushels and Port Colborne 3,402 bushels. U. S. LAKE PORTS. A large decrease is shown in Wheat of 1,257,130 bushels while decreases are noted in Oats and Barley of 584,773 bushels and 58,153 bushels respectively. A net decrease of 614,204 bushels.

U.S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. All grains show increases of 1,945,265 bushels showing that the grain is being moved to the Seaboard for exports. The said increases in each grain were as follows:- Wheat 1,539,670 bushels; Oats 40,673 bushels; Barley 100,719 bushels; and Rye 264,203 bushels.

IRVINGTON. The Receipts of bonded grain by Rail amounted to 87,293 bushels of Wheat, 7,702 bushels of Oats, and 9,321 bushels of Barley, a total of 104,316 bushels. The Shipments were 254,351 bushels of Wheat by Lake.

The Receipts for the period September 1, 1923 to November 23, 1923, were as follows:- Wheat 1,445,753 bushels; Barley 178,280 bushels; Rye 62,916 bushels; Oats 94,205 bushels, a total of 1,781,175 bushels. The Shipments were Wheat 460,017 bushels; Barley 177,432 bushels; Rye 83,517 bushels; Oats 43,750 bushels; a total of 769,766 bushels.






