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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 30, 1923.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended November 30, 1923 show a net decrease of 24,565 bushels in the quantity of grain in store from the previous week. The stocks for the week amounted to Wheat 203,547,165 bushels; Oats 17,501,324 bushels; Barley 4,721,762 bushels; Flax 2,068,297 bushels; Rye 3,433,463 bushels; a total of 131,262,031 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat 169,562 bushels; Barley 235,753 bushels; Flax 166,937 bushels; Rye 724,437 bushels, while Oats showed an increase of 1,270,194 bushels. The above is the reverse position from the previous week where a net increase was shown of 6,832,209 bushels while a net decrease is noted of 24,565 bushels this week.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in all grains in store of 4,236,572 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 3,600,323 bushels; Oats 684,524 bushels; and Rye 31,695 bushels. Decreases were shown in Barley of 10,378 bushels and Flax 19,592 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on November 23rd, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week also same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW & CALGARY). The quantity of grain in store shows a net decrease of 80,243 bushels. Wheat showed a decrease of 90,331 bushels, while increases are indicated in Oats, Barley, Flax and Rye of 6,853; 441; 1,783 and 1,006 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. A decrease took place in Wheat of 17,783 bushels while Oats showed an increase of 89 bushels making a net decrease of 17,694 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A large reduction of the grain in store is shown from the previous week. Wheat showed 8,151,299 bushels; Barley 20,118 bushels; Flax 182,351 bushels; Rye 67,908 bushels; A single increase is shown in Oats of 107,762 bushels, making a net decrease of 8,875,914 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A net decrease took place in all grains in store of 32,516 bushels. Decreases were shown in Wheat of 4,114 bushels and Oats 10,543 bushels, while Barley showed an increase of 2,141 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The stocks of grain in store show a net increase of 1,052,688 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 381,978 bushels and Oats 972,425 bushels. Decreases are shown in Barley of 275,407 bushels, Flax 7,957 bushels and Rye 38,351 bushels. 6,774,849 bushels and 903,232 bushels of Wheat were received by Vessel and Rail at the above Elevators for the past week. The Receipts by Vessel were as follows: Georgian Bay Ports 3,790,363 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,282,704 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 1,701,582 bushels, while Rail Receipts amounted to 379,795 bushels and 523,437 bushels at St. Lawrence and Seaboard Ports respectively.

The total Grain Receipts amounted to 9,541,759 bushels and 1,073,538 bushels by Vessel and Rail respectively. Georgian Bay Ports received 5,872,174 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,579,793 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 2,089,792 bushels. The Rail Receipts were 545,804 bushels and Seaboard Ports 527,734 bushels respectively.

U. S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The total quantity in store amounted to 2,266,181 bushels compared with 4,955,032 bushels a decrease of 2,688,851 bushels. Of the former amount (viz. 2,266,181 bushels) the Georgian Bay Port has 1,134,093 bushels in store while St. Lawrence Ports have 1,132,038 bushels. Of the latter amount 4,955,032 bushels the Georgian Bay Ports had 2,888,422 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 1,050,293 bushels; Seaboard Ports 116,317 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net increase is shown in all grains of 2,081,719 bushels. The increases are noted in Wheat of 2,629,014 bushels; Barley 39,516 bushels; Flax 41,130 bushels. A decrease is shown in Oats of 627,791 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. Increases are shown in Wheat, Oats, Barley of 1,462,630 bushels; 156,870 bushels; and 30,252 bushels respectively. Rye shows a decrease of 70,929 bushels, making a net increase of 1,578,821 bushels.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded grain by Rail amounted to 35,137 bushels of Wheat. The Shipments by Vessel were Wheat 117,361 bushels; Oats 70,553 bushels, a total of 187,914 bushels. There was a small rail shipment of 497 bushels.

The Receipts for the period September 1, 1923 to November 30, 1923 were as follows: Wheat 1,481,070 bushels; Barley 178,280 bushels; Rye 62,916 bushels; Oats 94,205 bushels; a total of 1,816,492 bushels. The Shipments were Wheat 577,398 bushels; Barley 248,035 bushels; Rye 83,517 bushels; Oats 48,750 bushels; a total of 957,680 bushels.
