CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 7th, 1923.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended December 7th, 1923, show a net increase of 1,965,766 bushels in the quantity of grain in store from the previous week. The stocks for the week amounted to Wheat 103,678,409 bushels; Oats 19,746,478 bushels; Barley 4,421,903 bushels; Flax 1,780,284 bushels; Rye 3,598,745 bushels; a total of 133,225,797 bushels. Decreases took place in Barley of 299,859 bushels and Flax 278,033 bushels while increases are shown in Wheat of 131,224 bushels; Oats 2,245,154 bushels and Rye 165,280 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net decrease of 1,932,115 bushels is shown in the stocks of grains in store from the previous week. Decreases were shown in Wheat of 1,836,016 bushels; Barley 40,070 bushels; Flax 70,225 bushels and Rye 6,150 bushels, while an increase took place in Oats of 20,346 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on November 30, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week also same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. All grains show a net increase of 114,926 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 105,642 bushels; Barley 1,274-bushels; and Rye 8,642 bushels while a single decrease is shown in Oats of 632 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATORS. Increases took place in Wheat of 301,518 bushels and Oats 102 bushels while Rye remained the same as the previous week, viz. 9,606 bushels. The total increase amounted to 301,720 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in all grains of 5,367,460 bushels from the previous week. The decreases took place in Wheat of 4,779,520 bushels; Oats 291,175 bushels; Barley 150,292 bushels; Flax 132,591 bushels. A single increase is shown in Rye of 36,118 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A net increase is shown in all grains of 24,465 bushels. The increases were Wheat 6,351 bushels; Oats 18,498 bushels; while Barley decreased 384 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. All grains show a net increase of 3,020,448 bushels. Wheat increased 1,498,676 bushels; Oats 1,509,590 bushels; Flax 15,963 bushels; while Barley decreased 3,781 bushels.

5,575,003 bushels and 649,799 bushels of Wheat were received at the above elevators during the week, by Vessel and Rail respectively. Georgian Bay Ports Receipts amounted to 3,311,281 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,229,955 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 1,033,067 bushels all by Vessel. The Rail Receipts are shown at St. Lawrence Ports of 124,630 bushels and Seaboard Ports 525,169 bushels. The total grain Receipts amounted to 8,216,138 bushels by Vessel and 951,872 bushels by Rail. Georgian Bay shows 4,785,614 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,465,997 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 1,964,327 bushels by Vessel. In addition St. Lawrence and Seaboard Ports show a Receipt of 142,867 bushels and 789,005 bushels respectively by Rail.

U.S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The total quantity in store amounted to 1,598,775 bushels compared with 4,151,468 bushels for the previous year. The bulk of the former is held at Georgian Bay Ports, the same being 1,163,065 bushels while St. Lawrence Ports, (Montreal and Quebec) have 435,710 bushels. In the previous year 2,392,738 bushels were shown in store at Georgian Bay Ports; St. Lawrence Ports 1,540,359 bushels and Seaboard Ports 218,371 bushels. For details of the movement of this grain see page 8 of the attached.

U.S. LAKE PORTS. Increases are shown in Wheat and Oats of 4,895,369 bushels and 1,050,244 bushels respectively while decreases took place in Barley of 102,303 bushels and Flax 41,180 bushels, making a net increase of 5,832,130 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net decrease is shown in all grains of 30,348 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 60,896 bushels; Oats 91,819 bushels; Barley 4,303 bushels. A single increase is shown in Rye of 126,670 bushels.

DULUTH. The Vessel Receipts of Bonded Grain amounted to 145,542 bushels of Wheat and 41,130 bushels of Flax, while the Rail Receipts were Wheat 29,173 bushels; Oats 2,156 bushels and Barley 6,095 bushels. There were no shipments during the week.

The Receipts for the period from September 1st, 1923 to December 7th, 1923, were as follows: Wheat 1,655,785 bushels; Barley 184,375 bushels; Rye 62,916 bushels; Oats 96,361 bushels; Flaxseed 41,201 bushels; a total of 2,040,638 bushels. The shipments remained the same as the previous week on account of there being no shipments during the week.




