CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING DECEMBER 14th, 1923.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended December 14th, 1923 show a net increase of 5,199,610 bushels in the quantity of all grain in store over the previous week. The stocks in store for the week amounted to Wheat 107,700,278 bushels; Oats 21,134,587 bushels; Barley 4,215,238 bushels; Flax 1,042,327 bushels; and Rye 3,712,377 bushels, a total of 138,425,407 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 4,042,469 bushels; Oats 1,368,109 bushels and Rye 153,634 bushels, while decreases took place in Barley and Flax of 206,665 and 157,937 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net decrease is noted in all grains of 3,158,221 bushels from the previous week. Wheat showed a decrease of 3,396,874 bushels; Flax 114,854 bushels; Rye 19,187 bushels. Increases were shown in Oats of 329,506 bushels and Barley 43,108 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on December 7th, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week also same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. The stocks of grain in store show an increase of 164,613 bushels over the previous week. This increase is made up as follows: Wheat 95,585 bushels; Oats 55,378 bushels; Barley 1,340 bushels; Flax 7,596 bushels; Rye 7,214 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. A net increase is shown in all grains of 25,535 bushels, a decrease was shown in Oats of 197 bushels while Wheat showed an increase of 25,732 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). All grains show a net increase of 1,149,579 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,675,523 bushels and Rye 19,576 bushels. Decreases are noted in Oats of 370,124 bushels; Barley 135,217 bushels; Flax 30,179 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WILLIAMS). A small increase of 91 bushels is shown in all grains. An increase took place in Wheat of 12,098 bushels, while Oats showed a decrease of 12,007 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. All grain shows a net increase of 2,264,930 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 1,795,740 bushels and Oats 476,042 bushels. Barley decreased 6,852 bushels.

4,235,284 bushels and 627,453 bushels were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. Georgian Bay Ports received 2,392,074 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,727,777 bushels; St. Lawrence ports 115,433 bushels, all by Vessel. The Rail receipts are shown at St. Lawrence ports of 272,761 bushels and Seaboard Ports 354,692 bushels. The total grain receipts were 5,464,370 bushels and 1,345,596 bushels by Vessel and Rail respectively. The Vessel receipts were Georgian Bay Ports 3,590,166 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,745,741 bushels and St. Lawrence Ports 128,463 bushels. The rail receipts were shown at St. Lawrence and Seaboard Ports of 291,370 bushels and 1,054,226 bushels respectively.

U.S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The total grain in store amounted to 1,565,315 bushels compared with 3,698,188 bushels for the previous year. The bulk of the former was held at Georgian Bay Ports, viz. 1,120,840 bushels while St. Lawrence Ports show 444,475 bushels. In the previous year the amount in store at the Georgian Bay Ports were 1,865,691 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 1,342,509 bushels and Canadian Seaboard 489,988 bushels. For details of the movement of this grain see page 8 of the attached.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net increase is shown in all grains of 5,595,377 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 4,986,561 bushels and Oats 643,418 bushels while a decrease is noted in Barley of 34,602 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. All grains show a net decrease of 852,294 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 1,151,896 bushels and Barley 74,522 bushels. Oats and Rye show 268,093 bushels and 106,051 bushels respectively.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded wheat amounted to 367,159 bushels by Vessel and 17,501 bushels by Rail. 20,488 bushels of the same was shipped by Rail.

The Receipts for the period from September 1, 1923 to December 14th, 1923 were as follows: Wheat 2,040,445 bushels; Barley 184,575 bushels; Rye 62,916 bushels; Oats 96,361 bushels; Flaxseed 41,201 bushels; a total of 2,425,298 bushels. The Shipments were Wheat 598,866 bushels; Barley 248,055 bushels; Rye 83,517 bushels; Oats 48,750 bushels; a total of 978,168 bushels.
