CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 4th, 1924.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended January 4th, 1924, show an increase in Canadian grains in store of 17,757,230 bushels over the previous week. The stocks in store for the week amounted to Wheat 142,543,635 bushels; Oats 24,522,813 bushels; Barley 4,904,214 bushels; Flax 2,095,358 bushels; and Rye 4,532,553 bushels; a total of 173,589,123 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 15,231,145 bushels; Oats 1,350,416 bushels; Barley 275,355 bushels; Flax 273,336 bushels; Rye 110,928 bushels, a total of 17,757,230 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in all grains in store of 2,105,702 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat and Oats of 2,099,561 bushels and 12,217 bushels, respectively, while increases are noted in Barley of 10,030 bushels; Flax 8,352 bushels; Rye 7,471 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on December 23rd, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week also same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in all grains in store of 443,464 bushels. Increases were shown in Wheat of 239,737 bushels; Oats 103,754 bushels; Barley 92,976 bushels and Rye 16,594 bushels while a decrease is shown in Flax of 4,597 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. A decrease is shown in all grains of 234,215 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 203,862 bushels and Rye 25,353 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). An increase is shown in all grains of 9,326,034 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 5,530,067 bushels; Oats 534,462 bushels; Barley 75,599 bushels; Flax 53,159 bushels; Rye 19,717 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. Decreases are shown in all grains of 31,068 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 4,529 bushels; Oats 26,428 bushels and Barley 111 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. (Canadian Grain). A net increase is shown in all grains of 3,195,794 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat 2,470,323 bushels; Oats 1,062,722 bushels; Barley 21,206 bushels while decreases took place in Flax of 50,268 bushels and Rye 308,189 bushels.

91,133 bushels and 889,724 bushels were received by Vessel and Rail at the above elevators. The former amount was received at the Lower Lake Ports. 121,596 bushels and 768,123 bushels were received at St. Lawrence and Seaboard Ports. The total grain receipts amounted to 459,348 bushels by Vessel and 1,298,621 bushels by Rail. Of the total Water receipts 342,895 bushels were received at Georgian Bay Ports and 116,453 at Lower Lake Ports. The Rail receipts were credited to St. Lawrence Ports of 172,181 bushels and Seaboard Ports 1,126,440 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. (United States Grain). The quantity in store amounted to 1,449,690 bushels compared with 3,131,383 bushels last year. Georgian Bay Ports have 1,002,831 bushels in store and St. Lawrence Ports (Montreal and Quebec) 446,859 bushels. In the previous year Georgian Bay Ports had in store 1,668,573 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 984,627 bushels; Seaboard Ports 478,183 bushels. The large quantity in store of one grain was Rye while Wheat, Corn, and Oats were the next in order. Last year the order was Corn, Rye, Oats and Wheat. For details of the movement see page 8 of the attached.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. The total grain in store increased 10,735,859 bushels made up of Wheat 10,094,377 bushels; Oats 2,181 bushels; Flax 257,680 bushels; Rye 369,621 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net decrease is shown in all grains of 575,936 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 308,100 bushels and Rye 29,933 bushels while Oats and Barley show increases of 185,943 and 76,155 bushels respectively.
