CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 14th, 1923.

Returns received by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending September 14th, 1923 show the total stocks of Canadian Grain in Store as follows: Wheat 7,081,388 bushels; Oats 3,534,508 bushels; Barley 2,100,771 bushels; Flax 235,334 bushels and Rye 2,521,128 bushels, a total of 15,473,129 bushels. Oats, Rye and Corn show decreases from the previous week of 277,121 bushels; 80,359 bushels; and 6,000 bushels respectively, while Wheat showed an increase of 1,385,271 bushels; Barley 219,795 bushels; Flax 46,374 bushels, making a net increase of 1,287,960 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The amount in store shows an increase in all the grains of 1,300,257 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,313,582 bushels; Oats 142,826 bushels; Barley 187,058 bushels; Flax 27,241 bushels; Rye 129,550 bushels. An increase is also shown in the Receipts and Shipments at the above elevators of 3,140,001 bushels and 1,523,630 bushels respectively.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in Store in Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces and in Western Ontario and British Columbia on September 7th, 1923.

THE INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW AND CALGARY) the stocks show a net decrease of 56,860 bushels. The decreases took place in Oats of 63,666 bushels and Rye 2,161 bushels while increases are shown in Wheat of 8,924 bushels and Barley 43 bushels.

IN THE VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR, Wheat in Store decreased 23,514 bushels, Oats remained the same as previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (Ft. William and Pt. Arthur). Increases are shown in all grains except Rye which showed a decrease of 259,482 bushels. The net increase was 242,429 bushels. The aforementioned increases took place in Wheat of 243,691 bushels; Oats 32,041 bushels; Barley 220,936 bushels; Flax 5,243 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in all grains of 18,268 bushels. Oats and Rye show increases of 4,935 and 20,816 bushels respectively, while decreases are noted in Wheat of 5,907 bushels and Barley 1,576 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The stocks show a net decrease over the previous week of 549,918 bushels. The decreases took place in Wheat of 12,546 bushels; Oats 435,280 bushels and Barley 175,539 bushels while the increases amounted to 13,890 in Flax and 59,557 bushels in Rye.

THE TOTAL RECEIPTS OF WHEAT AT THE ABOVE ELEVATORS were 904,745 by Vessel, 87,416 by Rail. Lower Lake Ports account for 379,350 of this and Georgian Bay Ports 274,067 bushels, while St. Lawrence Ports show 251,328 bushels. The rail receipt of 87,416 bushels is shown at the St. Lawrence Ports. The total receipts for all grains amounted to 1,845,362 bushels by Vessel and 87,416 bushels by Rail. St. Lawrence Ports received 980,555 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 511,363 bushels; Georgian Bay Ports 353,944 bushels by Vessel.

THE QUANTITY OF UNITED STATES GRAIN IN STORE AT THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST was 6,306,999 bushels as compared with 8,374,196 bushels at the same date last year. The following table shows quantities of each of the different grains comprised in these totals.

AT THE UNITED STATES LAKE PORTS a net decrease is shown in all grains in Store of 29,934 bushels made up as follows:- Increases in Oats of 56,685 bushels and Rye 13,793 bushels, while decreases are shown in Wheat of 63,047 bushels and Barley 37,365 bushels.

UNITED STATES ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The Grain in Storage shows a net decrease of 76,432 bushels. The decreases took place in Wheat, Oats, Rye and Corn of 87,726; 4,792; 1,000 and 6,000 bushels respectively while a single increase is shown in Barley of 23,086 bushels.

The above inspections for 1923 represent new crop. In addition there were 83 cars of Wheat, 26 Cars Oats, 3 cars Barley, 2 Cars Rye and 1 Car Screenings, a total of 115 cars, Old Crop inspections. Of the 4,705 Cars of New Crop inspections 3,330 cars or 71 % graded No. 3 and Better.

WHEAT. The Receipts of the Bonded Grain at Duluth for the two weeks ended September 14th, 1923 were as follows:- Wheat 80,854 bushels; Barley 12,559 bushels; Rye 26,531 bushels; Oats 2,685 bushels; a total of 122,629 bushels. There was only one shipment of 53,458 bushels of Wheat.






