CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 18TH, 1924.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended January 18th, 1924, show a net decrease in Canadian Grain in store of 3,132,737 bushels from the previous week. The stocks in store for the week amounted to Wheat 140,223,242 bushels; Oats 24,104,231 bushels; Barley 4,293,236 bushels; Flax 2,074,573 bushels; Rye 4,761,799 bushels, a total of 175,407,131 bushels. Wheat and Barley showed decreases of 3,278,961 bushels and 194,176 bushels respectively. Oats show an increase of 259,634 bushels; Flax 7,772 bushels and Rye 42,094 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in all grains in store of 4,455,908 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 4,583,152 bushels; Barley 46,161 bushels; Flax 18,900 bushels while increase are shown in Oats of 196,296 bushels and Rye 15,009 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on January 11, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week also same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. (CALGARY, SASKATOON & MOOSE JAW). A net increase is shown in all grains of 355,655 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 206,495 bushels; Oats 140,284 bushels; Barley 14,069 bushels and Rye 4,960 bushels, while a single decrease is shown in Flax of 153 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Increases took place in all grains of 60,167 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 55,510 bushels and Oats 4,657 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net increase is shown in all grains of 1,242,446 bushels. Wheat increased 2,089,603 bushels; Flax 23,681 bushels; Rye 52,557 bushels; Oats and Barley decreased 7,547 bushels and 215,828 bushels respectively.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. An increase took place in all grains of 28,774 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 594 bushels; Oats 24,139 bushels; Barley 3,991 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. CANADIAN GRAIN. A net decrease is shown in all grains of 1,646,725 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 1,649,172 bushels; Oats 30,149 bushels, while an increase is shown in Barley of 32,596 bushels.

79,994 bushels and 334,978 bushels of wheat were received by Vessel and Rail respectively at the above elevators for the week. The former item being a receipt at Port Colborne from grain afloat. The Rail receipts were credited to St. Lawrence Ports 57,518 bushels and Seaboard Ports 277,460 bushels.

The total grain Receipts were 516,176 bushels and 615,926 bushels by Vessel and Rail respectively. 436,182 bushels were received at Georgian Bay ports and 79,994 bushels at Lower Lake Ports by Vessel. The Rail receipts were shown at Lower Lake Ports of 2,362 bushels. St. Lawrence Ports 87,251 bushels and 526,313 bushels at Seaboard Ports.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. (U.S.GRAIN). The amount in store was 1,423,041 bushels for the week compared with 2,599,967 bushels for the same period last year, a decrease of 1,176,926 bushels. Of the former amount 928,298 bushels were in store at Georgian Bay Ports and 494,743 bushels at St. Lawrence Ports and Seaboard Ports. Last year the amount in store at Georgian Bay Ports was 1,426,664 bushels; St. Lawrence ports 727,991 bushels; Seaboard Ports 445,312 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in all grains of 1,934,994 bushels. A single decrease is noted in Wheat of 2,030,685 bushels while increases took place in Oats of 72,750 bushels; Barley 19,797 bushels; Flax 3,144 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. Increases took place in all grains of 511,152 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 367,254 bushels; Oats 110,846 bushels; Barley 2,640 bushels; Rye 30,412 bushels.

WHEAT. The receipts for the week ended January 18th, 1924 were Wheat 4,630 bushels; Barley 21,444 bushels; Flaxseed 3,144; a total of 29,218 bushels. The Shipments amounted to 3,055 bushels of wheat.

The receipts for the period from September 1, to January 18, 1924 were as follows: Wheat 2,264,190 bushels; Barley 211,059 bushels; Rye 69,916 bushels; Oats 98,541 bushels and Flaxseed 192,289 bushels. The Shipments were Wheat 646,651 bushels; Barley 283,354 bushels; Rye 83,517 bushels; Oats 48,750 bushels.
