CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 8th, 1924.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended February 8th, 1924 show net decrease in Canadian grain in store of 2,401,222 bushels from the previous week. The stocks in store for the week amounted to Wheat 134,869,950 bushels; Oats 24,175,302 bushels; Barley 4,259,682 bushels; Flax 1,748,443 bushels; Rye 4,908,092 bushels; a total of 169,961,474 bushels. Wheat decreased 2,962,297 bushels and Flax 26,103 bushels. Oats increased 402,443 bushels; Barley 149,356 bushels and Rye 35,379 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in all grains in store of 217,040 bushels over the previous week. Wheat shows a decrease of 363,774 bushels and Flax 7,181 bushels. Oats increased 492,162 bushels and Barley 73,828 bushels and Rye 22,005 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on February 1st, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week also same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. (CALGARY, SASKATOON AND MOOSE JAW). An increase is shown in all grains of 646,542 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 143,600 bushels; Oats 162,926 bushels; Barley 32,465 bushels; Flax 1,538 bushels; Rye 6,014 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Wheat shows an increase of 205,058 bushels. Oats and Rye remained the same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM AND PORT ARTHUR). A net increase is shown in all grains of 1,052,849 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 900,954 bushels; Oats 10,328 bushels; Barley 129,354 bushels and Rye 26,864 bushels. Flax decreased 14,651 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A net increase is shown in all grains of 133,281 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 114,055 bushels; Oats 19,259 bushels and Flax 191 bushels; while Barley showed a decrease of 224 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). Decreases took place in all grains of 2,302,705 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 2,031,978 bushels; Oats 202,398 bushels; Barley 53,757 bushels; Flax 6,000 bushels and Rye 8,572 bushels.

346,016 bushels and 385,931 bushels of Wheat were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. The Georgian Bay Ports received 266,845 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 79,191 bushels from Wheat afloat. 199,014 bushels were received at St. Lawrence Ports by Rail while Canadian Seaboard Ports received 186,917 bushels. The total Receipts were as follows: By Vessel 403,980 bushels; by Rail 655,968 bushels. The Vessel receipts at Georgian Bay were 324,809; Lower Lake Ports 79,171 bushels also from grain afloat. The Rail receipts were at St. Lawrence Ports of 249,045 bushels and Canadian Seaboard Ports 406,923 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). The amount in store was 1,341,666 bushels compared with 1,967,789 bushels last year a decrease of 626,123 bushels. Of the former amount 898,385 bushels were in store at Georgian Bay Ports while St. Lawrence Ports showed 445,781 bushels, while of the latter amount 1,269,007 bushels were in store at Georgian Bay Ports; 646,223 bushels at St. Lawrence Ports while the Seaboard Ports show 52,559 bushels. For details of the movement see page 8, grain statistics.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. Decreases took place in all grains of 2,203,824 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 2,100,195 bushels; Oats 98,397 bushels; Barley 10,232 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. Decreases took place in Wheat of 130,017 bushels; Barley 22,078 bushels and Rye 10,932 bushels. Oats increased 18,563 bushels.




