CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 15th, 1924.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended February 15th, 1924, show a net decrease of 767,040 bushels in Canadian grain in store from the previous week. The stocks in store were as follows: Wheat 132,851,060 bushels; Oats 25,217,591 bushels; Barley 4,449,608 bushels; Flax 1,731,854 bushels; Rye 4,944,321 bushels; a total of 169,194,434 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 2,018,890 bushels and Flax 16,594 bushels. Oats increased 1,042,289 bushels; Barley 189,926 bushels; and Rye 36,229 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The stocks in store for the week amounted to 57,324,021 bushels compared with 55,719,041 bushels an increase of 1,604,977 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 653,588 bushels; Oats 792,699 bushels; Barley 93,842 bushels; Flax 11,369 bushels; and Rye 48,479 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on February 8th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week also same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON AND MOOSE JAW). An increase is shown in all grains amounting to 709,472 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 463,786 bushels; Oats 278,412 bushels; Barley 47,556 bushels; Flax 1,016 bushels; and Rye 8,702.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATORS. A decrease is shown in Wheat of 83,428 bushels and Oats 386 bushels. Rye increased 3,075 bushels, making a net decrease of 85,814 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The stocks in store amounted to 58,650,369 bushels compared with 57,881,634 bushels, an increase of 768,758 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 654,791 bushels; Oats 79,126 bushels; Barley 20,610 bushels; Flax 1,427 bushels; and Rye 32,801 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). The quantity of grain in store amounted to 1,149,147 bushels compared with 779,363 bushels an increase of 369,784 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 329,339 bushels; Oats 34,133 bushels; Barley 4,660 bushels; Rye 2,262 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). Decreases are shown in all grains of 1,890,122 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,233,521 bushels; Oats 572,442 bushels; Barley 47,310 bushels; Flax 29,520 bushels and Rye 7,529 bushels.

998,317 bushels and 797,184 bushels of wheat were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. 24,000 bushels of the former were received at the Georgian Bay Elevators; 974,317 bushels at Lower Lake Ports. These amounts were taken from vessels afloat with winter storage. Of the total grain 998,317 bushels were received by Vessel and 949,757 bushels by Rail. 24,000 bushels being at the Georgian Bay Ports and 974,317 bushels at Lower Lake Ports all from winter storage. The rail receipts were 17,205 bushels from Lower Lake Ports; 214,311 bushels from St. Lawrence Ports and 718,241 bushels from Canadian Seaboard Ports.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U. S. GRAIN). A decrease is shown in the quantity of this grain in store of 1,120,217 bushels from the previous week. The amount in store this week amounted to 1,324,001 bushels compared with 2,444,218 bushels. Of the former amount 382 bushels were in store at the Georgian Bay Elevators and 441,491 bushels at the St. Lawrence Ports (Montreal and Quebec). Last year there were at the Georgian Bay Ports 1,260,129 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 1,143,815 bushels and at Seaboard Ports 40,274 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in all grains in store of 2,277,780 bushels. The decreases took place in Wheat of 2,328,222 bushels and Flax 886 bushels while Oats and Barley increased 49,701 bushels and 1,627 bushels respectively.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net decrease is also shown in the grain in store of 61,387 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 455,423 bushels and Rye 51,651 bushels while increases took place in Oats of 381,056 bushels and Barley 64,541 bushels.






