CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 14TH, 1924.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended March 14th, 1924 show a net increase of 1,172,970 bushels over the previous week. The stocks in store for the week were as follows: Wheat 126,531,675 bushels; Oats 30,194,950 bushels; Barley 5,197,609 bushels; Flax 1,804,103 bushels; Rye 5,813,162 bushels; a total of 168,553,437 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 902,802 bushels and Rye 221,838 bushels. Decreases are noted in Oats of 1,790,971 bushels; Barley 475,071 bushels and Flax 32,968 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. An increase is shown in all grains in store of 3,323,874 bushels over the previous week, made up as follows: Wheat 1,713,567 bushels; Oats 1,537,767 bushels; Barley 112,350 bushels; Flax 34,724 bushels; Rye 70,456 bushels. The total grain in store for the week amounted to 67,067,304 bushels compared with 63,743,930 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on March 7th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week also same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON & MOOSE JAW). Stocks show a net increase of 142,197 bushels over the previous week. Wheat decreased 37,461 bushels while increases took place in Oats of 177,100 bushels; Barley 1,436 bushels; and Rye 1,122 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Oats show a decrease of 7,412 bushels while Wheat increased 15,918 bushels; Barley 1,365 bushels; and Rye 18 bushels a net increase of 10,519 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net increase took place in all grains in store of 850,375 bushels. The increases are shown in Wheat of 161,593 bushels; Oats 539,331 bushels; Barley 145,105 bushels and Rye 6,103 bushels while Flax showed a decrease of 1,756 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the stocks of 36,355 bushels. Decreases took place in Oats of 31,874 bushels and Barley 6,119 bushels while Wheat showed an increase of 719 bushels, and Rye 379 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST, (CANADIAN GRAIN). Decreases are shown in all grain of 1,050,344 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 612,046 bushels; Oats 367,177 bushels; Barley 31,438 bushels and Rye 39,683 bushels.


Receipts of Wheat at the above elevators amounted to 584,580 bushels by Vessel and 805,346 bushels by Rail. The former amount was taken from grain afloat at Georgian Bay and Lower Lake Ports, the amounts being 245,819 bushels and 338,761 bushels respectively, while the latter at the St. Lawrence Ports amounting to 112,413 bushels and Seaboard Ports 692,933 bushels. The total grain receipts were 584,580 bushels by Vessel and 1,253,729 bushels by Rail. The Vessel receipts were the same as the Wheat and are credited to the Georgian Bay and Lower Lake Ports. The Rail Receipts were as follows:- Lower Lake Ports 10,000 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 157,835 bushels; and Seaboard Ports 1,084,544 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). The quantity of U. S. grain in store was 1,181,018 bushels compared with 2,012,329 bushels, a decrease of 831,311 bushels. The amount in store by different classes of elevators in the East were as follows:-

U.S. LAKE PORTS. Wheat decreased 2,210,048 bushels and Oats 63,514 bushels, a total of 2,273,662 bushels while Barley, Flax and Rye remained the same as the previous week.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net increase is shown in all grains of 205,365 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 59,926 bushels; Oats 156,810 bushels; and Barley 250,362 bushels while Rye showed a decrease of 200,233 bushels. Erratum- On February 29th, 1924, Grain Statistics, 750,777 bushels of Oats was shown as Barley.




