CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING SEPTEMBER 21st, 1923.

Returns received by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending September 21st, 1923 show a net increase in the Stocks in Store of Canadian Grain of 10,222,036 bushels. The amount in store for the week being Wheat 16,925,339 bushels; Oats 3,279,492 bushels; Barley 2,395,893 bushels; Flax 311,823 bushels; Rye 2,732,603 bushels, a total of 25,695,155 bushels. Oats showed the only decrease the same being 255,106 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 9,843,951 bushels Barley 295,127 bushels; Flax 76,494 bushels; Rye 261,430 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The amount in store has increased over the previous week by 7,159,714 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 6,297,131 bushels; Oats 273,621 bushels; Barley 303,863 bushels; Flax 65,844 bushels; and Rye 199,205 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in Store in the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces and in Western Ontario and British Columbia on September 14th, 1923.

THE INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW AND CALGARY). The Stocks show a net decrease of 13,916 bushels. An increase took place in Wheat of 12,262 bushels while Oats and Rye show 29,524 bushels and 1,654 bushels decreases respectively.

IN THE VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR an increase is shown in Wheat of 39 bushels and Oats 5,730 bushels a total of 5,769 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM & PT. ARTHUR) the quantity in Store shows an increase of 5,363,148 bushels over the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 2,949,013 bushels; Oats 75,556 bushels; Barley 313,289 bushels; Flax 24,540 bushels; Rye 2,915 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in all Grains of 5,447 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 7,339 bushels; Oats 1,053 bushels; Barley 1,617 bushels. A single decrease in Rye is noted of 5,067 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The Grain in Store shows a net decrease of 803,572 bushels. Oats, Barley and Flax showing decreases of 602,143 bushels; 290,909 bushels; and 13,890 bushels respectively, while Wheat shows 32,953 bushels and Rye 65,117 bushels.

The total Receipts of Wheat at the above elevators were 1,593,19 bushels by Vessel and 5,242 by Rail. The bulk of this was received at Georgian Bay Ports, the amount being 910,537 bushels by Vessel. St. Lawrence Ports were next with 373,467 bushels and 5,024 bushels by Vessel and Rail respectively, while Lower Lake Ports received 309,250 bushels by Vessel and 213 by Rail. The total Receipts of all Grains amounted to 2,412,660 bushels by Vessel and 24,935 bushels by Rail. The Georgian Bay Ports account for 1,326,597 bushels while Lower Lake Ports show 753,339 bushels and St. Lawrence Ports show 632,974 bushels all by Vessel. The Rail Receipts were 213 bushels at Lower Lake Ports and 24,723 bushels at St. Lawrence Ports.

The Quantity of United States Grain in Store at the Public Elevators in the East was 5,996,134 bushels compared with 10,330,639 bushels for the same period last year. AT THE UNITED STATES LAKE PORTS the stocks show increases in all grains of 550,900 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 537,230 bushels; Oats 4,910 bushels; Barley 7,760 bushels; Rye 1,000 bushels.

UNITED STATES ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net decrease is shown in all grains amounting to 40,154 bushels. The decreases took place in Oats of 2,049 bushels; Barley 45,493 bushels; Rye 36 bushels, while increase of 7,424 bushels was shown in Wheat.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded Grain for the week ending September 21st amounted to 86,787 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 61,463 bushels; Barley 19,486 bushels; Rye 1,050 bushels; Oats 4,788 bushels. For the period from September 1 to 21st the amounts were Wheat 142,317; Barley 32,045; Rye 27,581 bushels; Oats 7,473 bushels, a total of 209,416 bushels. The shipments remained the same as previous week.
