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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 28th, 1924.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended March 28th, 1924, show a net decrease in grain stocks in Canada of 378,369 bushels over the previous week. The stocks in store for the week were as follows: Wheat 123,913,706 bushels; Oats 32,113,600 bushels; Barley 5,628,367 bushels; Flax 1,327,578 bushels and Rye 4,608,941 bushels; a total of 167,092,692 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 2,117,243 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 901,425 bushels; Barley 302,383 bushels; Flax 6,280 bushels and Rye 28,786 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Increases are shown in all grains in store of 2,681,254 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 1,018,030 bushels; Oats 1,374,608 bushels; Barley 208,164 bushels; Flax 16,025 bushels and Rye 64,427 bushels. The total in store for the week was 72,365,434 bushels compared with 69,684,180 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia, on March 21st, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON AND MOOSEJAW). A net decrease is shown in all grains of 110,691 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 54,024 bushels; Oats 51,274 bushels; Barley 1,527 bushels; and Flax 3,873 bushels. ^{While} an increase is shown in Rye of 7 bushels only.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Wheat stocks increased 229,009 bushels and Oats 254 bushels making a total increase of 229,263 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net increase of 858,943 bushels is recorded in all grains in store. Wheat, Oats, Barley and Rye showing increases of 333,387 bushels; 451,517 bushels; 74,837 bushels and 5,074 bushels respectively while Flax showed a small decrease of 5,872 bushels. The amount in store amounted to 63,581,103 bushels compared with 62,722,160 bushels

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. The stocks in store show a net decrease of 25,132 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 1,826 bushels and Oats 24,883 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 1,577 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a decrease of 1,693,003 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,054,388 bushels; Oats 529,123 bushels; Barley 11,007 bushels and Rye 98,485 bushels.

326,266 bushels of Wheat were received by Rail at the above elevators, made up as follows:- Lower Lake Ports 44,043 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 30,764 bushels; and Canadian Seaboard 326,266 bushels. The total grain Receipts were as follows:- Lower Lake Ports 44,043 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 97,052 bushels and Canadian Seaboard Ports were 523,912 bushels, making a total Receipt of 665,007 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). The amount in store was 1,005,992 bushels compared with 1,536,220 bushels for the same week last year. The quantities in store by the different classes of elevators were as follows:-

U. S. LAKE PORTS. Decreases are shown in Wheat in store of 1,907,675 bushels and Oats 528,216 bushels, making a total decrease of 2,435,891 bushels. Flax, Rye, Barley and Flax and Rye stocks remain the same as the previous week.
