CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 4th, 1924

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended April 4th, 1924, show a net decrease in grain stocks of 4,421,235 bushels from the previous week. The stocks in store for the week were as follows:-  
 Wheat 113,764,960 bushels; Oats 32,866,661 bushels; Barley 5,739,511 bushels; Flax 1,813,216 bushels and Rye 4,487,059 bushels, a total of 163,671,407 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 5,148,746 bushels; Flax 14,362 bushels and Rye 121,882 bushels while increases are shown in Oats of 173,601 bushels and Barley 110,644 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in all grains in store of 119,669 bushels. Increases took place in Oats of 147,242 bushels and Barley 21,304 bushels while decreases are noted in Wheat of 121,961 bushels; Flax 16,711 bushels and Rye 10,205 bushels. The total stocks for the week were 72,485,103 bushels compared with 72,365,434 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia, on March 28th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON & MOCSE JAW). A net increase is shown in all grains in store of 24,016 bushels. Oats show an increase of 94,789 bushels and Barley 1,378 bushels while Wheat and Rye decreased 66,367 bushels and 3,785 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Wheat stocks decreased 53,951 bushels and Oats increased 6,682 bushels making a net decrease of 47,269 bushels.



PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). Increases are shown in all grains in store of 466,647 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 236,596 bushels; Oats 155,967 bushels; Barley 65,647 bushels; Flax 2,343 bushels; and Rye 6,035 bushels. The total amount in store was 64,047,746 bushels compared with 63,581,103 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. The stocks in store show a net decrease of 134,038 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 90,204 bushels and Oats 45,439 bushels while Barley showed an increase of 1,555 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). Decreases are shown in all grains in store of 1,066,105 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 836,637 bushels; Oats 179,517 bushels; Barley 11,320 bushels and Rye 38,631 bushels.

201,311 bushels were received by Rail at the above elevators, 7,460 bushels of which are shown as a Receipt at the Lower Lake Ports; 31,726 bushels at St. Lawrence Ports and 162,625 bushels at Seaboard Ports. The total grain Receipts show that 594,429 bushels were received by Rail and 90,630 bushels of Oats by Vessel at the Lower Lake Ports. This latter amount was taken from the grain afloat at Port Colborne. The former amount is made up of receipts at Lower Lake Ports 7,460 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 82,950 bushels and Canadian Seaboard 504,019 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). The amount in store was 901,242 bushels compared with 1,499,137 bushels for the same week last year. The quantities in store by the different classes of elevators were as follows:-

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in all grains of 3,693,931 bushels. Wheat decreased 4,016,191 bushels while Oats increased 322,210 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 90,170 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 200,031 bushels and Rye 75,346 bushels. Oats increased 153,127 bushels and Barley 32,080 bushels.
