CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 11th, 1924.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended April 11th, 1924 show a net decrease of 3,279,322 bushels from the previous week. The stocks in store for the week were as follows:- Wheat 114,661,976 bushels; Oats 32,984,881 bushels; Barley 5,743,801 bushels; Flax 1,808,435 bushels and Rye 4,492,992 bushels a total of 159,692,085 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 4,102,984 bushels and Flax 4,781 bushels while increases are shown in Oats of 118,220 bushels; Barley 4,290 bushels and Rye 5,833 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in all grains in store of 515,272 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 719,579 bushels. The other grains show increases as follows: Oats 158,477 bushels; Barley 32,767 bushels; Flax 9,396 bushels and Rye 3,457 bushels. The total grain stocks were 71,969,821 bushels compared with 72,485,103 bushels last week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on April 4th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON & MOOSE JAW.) A net decrease is shown in all grains in store of 82,192 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 168,162 bushels; Flax 905 bushels and Rye 10,013 bushels while Oats increased 94,474 bushels and Barley 2,418 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Wheat and Oats show an increase of 111,579 bushels and 105 bushels respectively. Barley decreased 424 bushels making a net increase of 111,560 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (Ft. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net increase is shown in all grains in store for the week of 297,320 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 301,097 bushels; Barley 15,435 bushels and Rye 1,238 bushels while decreases are noted in Oats of 7,324 bushels and Flax 13,166 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. Decreases are shown in all grains in store of 103,126 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 96,607 bushels; Oats 2,662 bushels; Barley 2,568 bushels; Flax 108 bushels; Rye 1,175 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). A net decrease is shown in all grains of 914,631 bushels and are as follows: Wheat 876,191 bushels and Rye 50,362 bushels. Oats and Barley show increase of 5,395 bushels and 6,527 bushels respectively.

The Receipts of Wheat at the above elevators were 251,924 bushels at the Georgian Bay Ports while 42,581 bushels were received by Rail of which 11,922 bushels were to Lower Lake Ports; 1,811 bushels to St. Lawrence Ports; and 28,843 bushels to Seaboard Ports. The Receipts for the total grains were the same as Wheat. The Rail Receipts for total grain was 481,631 bushels. The bulk going to Seaboard Ports viz. 431,942 bushels. The remainder went to St. Lawrence Ports and Lower Lake Ports, the amounts being 37,767 bushels and 11,922 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S.GRAIN). The quantity of U. S. grain in store amounted to 868,192 bushels compared with 1,415,979 bushels for the same week last year. The quantities in store by the different classes of elevators were as follows:-

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A decrease is shown in all grains in store of 2,445,799 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 2,345,146 bushels and Oats 100,653 bushels. Barley, Flax and Rye stocks remain the same as previous weeks.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net decrease is shown in all grains in store of 389,960 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 310,169 bushels; Oats 29,876 bushels; Barley 49,915 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 62,788 bushels.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded Grain for the week ended April 12th, 1924 amounted to Wheat 1,724 bushels. There were no shipments for the week.
