CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 2nd, 1924.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended May 2nd, 1924, show a net decrease of 7,281,655 bushels from the previous week. The stocks in store for the week were as follows:- Wheat 90,941,201 bushels; Oats 31,543,863 bushels; Barley 5,260,409 bushels; Flax 1,450,054 bushels and Rye 4,164,328 bushels, a total of 133,359,855 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 8,493,076 bushels; Flax 164,843 bushels and Rye 15,205 bushels while increases are shown in Oats of 1,589,213 bushels and Barley 2,251 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in all grains in store from the previous week of 3,250,713 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 1,942,352 bushels; Oats 717,760 bushels; Barley 435,598 bushels; Flax 106,073 bushels and Rye 148,835 bushels. The total grain in store was 65,505,630 bushels compared with 68,756,348 bushels last week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on April 25th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON & MOOSE JAW). A net decrease is shown in all grains in store of 475,620 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 251,373 bushels; Oats 204,755 bushels; Barley 10,338 bushels; Flax 1,933 bushels; and Rye 7,136 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. A net increase is shown in all grains in store of 61,511 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 60,215 bushels; Oats 139 bushels and Rye 1,157 bushels.



PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in all grains in stores of 11,660,118 bushels: Wheat and Flax show decreases of 13,145,412 and 67,045 bushels respectively. Increases took place in Oats of 853,709 bushels; Barley 465,846 bushels and Rye 225,784 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. An increase is shown in Oats of 28,719 bushels while decreases are shown in Wheat of 7,574 bushels; Barley 1,143 bushels; Flax 1,447 bushels and Rye 225 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). A net increase is shown in the grains in store of 4,125,249 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 2,605,191 bushels; Oats 1,528,836 bushels and Flax 11,710 bushels. Barley and Rye show decreases of 11,092 and 9,396 bushels respectively.

The Receipts of Wheat at the above elevators were 3,222,686 and 596,152 bushels by Vessel and Rail respectively. Georgian Bay Ports received 2,258,920 bushels by Vessel; Lower Lake Ports 2,560 bushels by Vessel and 2,625 bushels by Rail and St. Lawrence Ports 361,206 bushels by Vessel and 593,527 bushels by Rail. The total grain receipts were 5,787,285 bushels by Vessel and 603,659 bushels by Rail. Georgian Bay Ports received 4,343,850 bushels by Vessel; Lower Lake Ports 184,931 bushels by Vessel and 2,625 bushels by Rail and St. Lawrence Ports 1,258,504 bushels by Vessel and 601,034 bushels by Rail.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. (U.S. GRAIN). The quantity of U. S. grain in store amounted to 889,743 bushels compared with 1,178,242 bushels last year. The quantities in store by the different classes of elevators were as follows:-


