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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 16th, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending May 16th, 1924 show a decrease of 9,308,306 bushels from the previous week. The stocks at the end of the week were as follows:- Wheat 78,955,999 bushels; Oats 27,775,125 bushels; Barley 4,739,558 bushels; Flax 1,715,701 bushels; Rye 3,602,130; a total of 116,388,513 bushels. The decreases are shown in Wheat of 5,551,803 bushels; Oats 2,855,015 bushels; Barley 778,869 bushels; Flax 24,844 bushels; Rye 27,775 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 5,345,360 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 3,314,129 bushels; Oats 1,397,888 bushels; Barley 396,620 bushels; Flax 112,771 bushels; and Rye 117,952 bushels. The total grain in store was 56,676,085 bushels compared with 62,021,445 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on May 9th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW AND SASKATOON). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 783,198 bushels from the previous week. Decreases took place in Wheat of 539,316 bushels; Oats 156,795 bushels; Barley 32,685 bushels and Rye 3,902 bushels while Flax showed an increase of 568 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Wheat shows a decrease of 311,001 bushels; Oats and Rye increased 5,547 and 34,756 bushels respectively, making a net decrease of 270,702 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR). Decreases are shown in the total grain in store of 5,188,125 bushels from the previous week. Wheat showed a decrease of 3,753,005 bushels; Oats 1,396,097 bushels; Barley 94,423 bushels and Rye 49,966 bushels while Flax increased 105,368 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 260,635 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 177,509 bushels; Oats 30,304 bushels; Barley 3,123 bushels and Flax 299 bushels, while Rye increased 555 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 1,159,941 bushels. Wheat and Rye showing increases of 1,420,005 bushels and 73,455 bushels respectively, while Oats decreased 143,223 bushels; Barley 178,586 bushels and Flax 11,710 bushels.

7,198,408 bushels and 65,053 bushels of Wheat were received by Vessel and Rail respectively at the above elevators during the week. The bulk of the former arrived at St. Lawrence Ports, the amount being 2,597,207 bushels; Lower Lake Ports received 2,725,405 bushels; and Georgian Bay Ports 1,575,796 bushels. The Rail receipts are credited to St. Lawrence Ports amounting to 65,053 bushels.

The total grain receipts amounted to 9,632,320 bushels and 281,915 bushels by Vessel and Rail respectively. These Receipts took place in the following order; St. Lawrence Ports 3,332,114 bushels by Water and 281,915 bushels by Rail; Lower Lake Ports 3,200,224 bushels and Georgian Bay Ports 3,080,582 bushels. The last two amounts were also by Water.



PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U. S. GRAIN). The amount of U. S. Grain in store for the week was 1,904,820 bushels compared with 2,715,659 bushels for the same week last year. The quantities in store by classes of elevators were as follows:-

U. S. LAKE PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net increase of 603,822 bushels, wheat and oats showing increases of 527,209 and 146,273 bushels respectively while Barley showed a decrease of 69,560 bushels. The quantity of Flax and Rye in store remained the same.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 775,433 bushels. Wheat increased 246,547 bushels and Oats 167,476 bushels while Barley and Rye show decreases of 3,867 and 34,719 bushels respectively.

DULUTH. There was no movement of bonded grain through Duluth for the week.


