## CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 23rd, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending May 23rd, 1924 show a decrease of 15,345,194 bushels from the previous week. The stocks at the end of the week were as follows:- Wheat 66,830,564 bushels; Oats 25,547,040 bushels; Barley 4,194,801 bushels; Flax 1,245,792 bushels; Rye 3,227,122 bushels; a total of 101,643,319 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 12,125,135 bushels; Oats 2,228,085 bushels; Barley 544,757 bushels; Flax 71,909 bushels and Rye 575,005 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Decreases are shown in the total grain in store of 7,398,224 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 5,269,022 bushels; Oats 1,574,764 bushels; Barley 312,583 bushels; Flax 152,624 bushels and Rye 108,421 bushels. The total grain in store was 49,277,861 bushels compared with 56,676,035 bushels last week and 19,831,714 bushels for the same week last year.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on May 16th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. (CALGARY, WOOSIAT & SASKATOON). The total grain in store shows a decrease from previous week of 533,307 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 455,701 bushels; Oats 67,586 bushels; Barley 14,810 bushels; and Flax 110 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Wheat shows a decrease of 90,163 bushels while Oats increased 4,105 bushels and Rye 3,318 bushels making a net decrease of 82,745 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 4,053,657 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,144,240 bushels; Oats 591,425 bushels; Barley 377,573 bushels and Rye 2,803 bushels while Flax shows an increase of 62,354 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 475,786 bushels. Wheat showed a decrease of 402,141 bushels; Oats 75,551 bushels; Flax 1,524 bushels and Rye 12 bushels while Barley increased 3,522 bushels.


PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 657,842 bushels from the previous week. Wheat, Oats and Rye show decreases of 644,913 bushels; 47,951; and 32,203 bushels respectively while Barley increased 117,425 bushels.

5,705,942 and 910,955 bushels of Wheat were received by Water and Rail respectively at the above elevators during the week. Of the former amount Georgian Bay Ports received 1,375,143 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 1,307,012 bushels; and St. Lawrence Ports 3,063,487 bushels. The 910,955 Rail receipts are credited to St. Lawrence Ports.

The total grain receipts amounted to 7,786,625 bushels by Vessel and 1,606,458 bushels by Rail. They took place in the following order as to quantities: St. Lawrence Ports 3,623,776 bushels; Georgian Bay Ports 2,141,400 bushels; and Lower Lake Ports 2,016,449 bushels. The Rail receipts are credited to St. Lawrence Ports 1,602,853 bushels and Lower Lake Ports 3,606 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U. S. GRAIN). 1,293,770 bushels of U. S. Grain are in store at the above elevator compared with 4,439,011 bushels for the same period last year. The quantities in store by classes of elevators were as follows:-

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in the total grains in store of 2,022,929 bushels. Wheat, Oats and Flax shows decreases of 1,786,392; and 323,925 bushels respectively while Barley shows an increase of 87,382 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 116,004 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 332,058; Barley 43,151; and Rye 184,827 bushels while an increase is shown in Oats of 449,092 bushels.






