CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 30th, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending May 30th, 1924 show a decrease of 8,460,969 bushels from the previous week. The stocks at the end of the week were as follows:- Wheat 60,967,150 bushels; Oats 23,808,504 bushels; Barley 3,931,742 bushels; Flax 988,242 bushels; Rye 2,836,732 bushels; a total of 92,582,550 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 5,863,434 bushels; Oats 1,738,536 bushels; Barley 263,059 bushels; Flax 255,550 bushels and Rye 340,390 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Decreases are shown in the total grain in store of 4,646,552 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 3,438,142 bushels; Oats 1,110,900 bushels; Barley 136,119 bushels; Flax 87,933 bushels and Rye 73,161 bushels. The total grain in store was 44,431,306 bushels compared with 49,277,361 bushels for the same week last year.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on May 23rd, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW & SASKATOON). The total grain in store shows a decrease from the previous week of 460,476 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 424,367 bushels; Oats 31,731 bushels; Barley 3,491 bushels; Flax 104 bushels and Rye 783 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Wheat shows a decrease of 61,641 bushels while Oats show an increase of 6,396 bushels, making a net decrease of 55,245 bushels. The quantity of Barley and Rye remained the same as previous week, viz., 1,541 and 39,112 bushels respectively.



PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 997,602 bushels. Decreases took place in Oats of 264,477 bushels; Barley 447,753 bushels; Flax 167,875 bushels and Rye 234,295 bushels while Wheat showed an increase of 116,793 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 272,636 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 230,487 and 44,523 bushels, respectively while Barley increased 1,404 bushels; Flax 44 bushels and Rye 926 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 836,563 bushels, Wheat showing an increase of 559,817 bushels; Oats 302,282 bushels; Barley 57,508 bushels and Flax 313 bushels while Rye shows a decrease of 85,252 bushels.

7,324,230 and 2,009,881 bushels of Wheat were received by Vessel and Rail at the above elevators during the week. The Receipts by Vessel are credited in the following order as to quantity: St. Lawrence Ports 2,606,330 bushels; Georgian Bay Ports 2,368,507 bushels; and Lower Lake Ports 2,349,393 bushels. The 2,009,881 bushels were received at St. Lawrence Ports by Rail. The total grain Receipts amounted to 9,325,935 bushels by Vessel and 2,507,036 bushels by Rail. Of the former amount Georgian Bay Ports received 3,732,019 bushels; St. Lawrence Ports 3,085,560 bushels; and Lower Lake Ports 2,458,556 bushels, while 2,505,292 bushels of the Rail Receipts went to St. Lawrence Ports and the small amount 1,744 bushels to Lower Lake Ports.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). 2,254,645 bushels of U. S. grain are in store compared with 4,776,629 bushels for the same period last year. The quantities in store by classes of elevators were as follows:-

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 2,287,798 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 1,898,814 bushels and Oats 451,409 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 62,425 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 377,220 bushels; Wheat and Oats showing decreases of 436,293 and 144,174 bushels respectively while Barley and Rye increased 203,077 and 50,175 bushels respectively.


