CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 6th, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending June 6th, 1924 show a decrease of 7,038,026 bushels from the previous week. The stocks at the end of the week were as follows:- Wheat 55,194,049 bushels; Oats 23,129,886 bushels; Barley 3,672,544 bushels; Flax 821,150 bushels; Rye 2,726,695 bushels; a total of 85,544,324 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 5,773,081 bushels; Oats 678,618 bushels; Barley 259,198 bushels; Flax 167,092 bushels and Rye 160,037 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a decrease from the previous week of 4,294,934 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 3,161,030 bushels; Oats 968,412 bushels; Barley 75,741 bushels; Flax 31,949 bushels and Rye 57,802 bushels. The amount in store was 40,136,372 bushels compared with 44,431,306 bushels last week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on May 30th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

NOTE:- The large increase in the platform loadings is accounted for by receipt of returns which heretofore had not been included.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW & SASKATOON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 762,022 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 661,609 bushels; Oats 82,920 bushels; Barley 17,288 bushels; Flax 205 bushels; Rye remains the same as the previous week.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 414,593 bushels. Increases are noted in Wheat of 263,483 bushels; Oats 173,376 bushels; and Barley 14,632 bushels while Rye shows a decrease of 36,898 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 495,475 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 268,654 bushels; Oats 115,102 bushels; Barley 55,732 bushels and Flax 134,227 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 78,242 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 6,683 bushels. Wheat, Flax and Rye show decreases of 960; 711 and 835 bushels respectively while Oats and Barley show increases of 7,082 and 2,107 bushels making a net increase of 6,683 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 143,120 bushels. Wheat showed a decrease of 104,057 bushels while increases are shown in Oats of 241,168 bushels and 5,989 bushels Barley. The quantity of Flax and Rye remains the same as the previous week.

8,262,635 and 2,561,103 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. Of these amounts 5,535,186 bushels and 2,179,561 bushels was Wheat. The receipts of the same by classes of ports were as follows:-

CANADIAN SEACOAST PORTS (MONTREAL AND QUEBEC). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 132,533 bushels over the previous week. Wheat shows an increase of 369,144 bushels and Barley 23,724 bushels. Oats show a decrease of 210,235 bushels. The Shipments overseas according to the elevator returns amounted to 5,441,663 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 4,330,328 bushels; Oats 735,100 bushels; and Barley 375,735 bushels. The in store for Flax and Rye was the same for both weeks, viz. 318 and 75,924 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). 1,754,851 bushels of U. S. grain was in store compared with 4,160,437 bushels in store for the same period last year. The quantities in store by classes of elevators were as follows:-

The Shipments of U. S. Grain overseas according to the Elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 297,450 bushels and Rye 563,416 bushels; a total of 865,866 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain stored of 705,353 bushels. Wheat and Barley show decreases of 1,022,396 bushels and 141,092 bushels respectively while Oats showed an increase of 458,135 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,344,640 bushels from the previous week. Wheat, Oats and Rye show decreases of 817,878; 391,945 and 142,744 bushels respectively while Barley showed an increase of 7,927 bushels.

DULUTH. The amount of bonded grain received at Duluth for the week ended June 7th, 1924, was Wheat 1,359 bushels by Rail.
