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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JUNE 27th, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending June 27, 1924 show a decrease of 2,183,506 bushels from the previous week. The stocks at the end of the week were as follows:- Wheat 44,756,222 bushels; Oats 22,357,360 bushels; Barley 2,606,188 bushels; Flax 736,813 bushels; Rye 2,544,836 bushels; a total of 73,011,419 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,012,534 bushels; Barley 112,424 bushels; Flax 64,953 bushels; Rye 77,328 bushels; while Oats show an increase of 1,033,733 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain show a decrease of 3,191,569 bushels from the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 2,591,323 bushels; Oats 516,171 bushels; Barley 1,502 bushels; Flax 9,093 bushels; and Rye 77,480 bushels. The total quantity in store was 23,357,079 bushels compared with 31,548,648 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on June 20th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW & SASKATOON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 355,087 bushels made up as follows:- Oats 292,459 bushels; Barley 23,504 bushels; Flax 210 bushels and Rye 771 bushels, and wheat 36,143 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Wheat shows an increase of 33,080 bushels while Oats shows a decrease of 1,656 bushels, making a net increase of 31,424 bushels. The quantity of Barley and Rye remains the same as previous week, viz.- 2,759 bushels and 6,473 bushels respectively. The total grain in store was 1,287,132 bushels compared with 1,255,683 bushels for the previous week.



PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 1,732,741 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 684,366 bushels; Oats 1,135,341 bushels and Rye 102,961 bushels, while Barley and Flax show decreases of 132,313 and 55,614 bushels respectively. The amount of grain in store at the Head of the Lakes was 25,710,474 compared with 23,977,733 bushels last week.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a net increase of 3,933 bushels. Increases took place in wheat of 4,780 bushels and oats 3,578 bushels. Barley and Flax show decreases of 4,189 and 36 bushels respectively. Rye stocks remain the same as previous week, viz.- 232 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. (CANADIAN GRAIN).- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 135,814 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 259,297 bushels; Barley 20,337 bushels; Rye 13,696 bushels, while Oats shows an increase of 107,516 bushels.

6,397,802 bushels and 308,800 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by vessel and rail during the week. Of these amounts 4,983,207 bushels and 222,584 bushels were wheat. The receipts of the above by classes of Ports were as follows:-

CANADIAN SEABOARD PORTS (MONTREAL AND QUEBEC). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 51,551 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 174,844 and 95,397 bushels respectively, while decreases were shown in Barley 205,014 bushels and Rye 13,696 bushels. There was no movement of grain at the Canadian Atlantic Seaboard Ports. The overseas shipments for the above ports according to Elevator returns amounted to - Wheat 3,038,945 bushels; Oats 152,023 bushels; Barley 290,310 bushels and Rye 13,696 bushels, a total of 3,494,974 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN) 1,944,953 bushels of U.S. Grain were in store compared with 3,519,231 bushels for the same week last year. The quantities in store by classes of Ports were as follows:-

The shipments of U.S. Grain overseas from Montreal and Quebec according to elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 621,819 bushels, and Rye 259,465 bushels, a total of 881,284 bushels.



U.S. LAKE PORTS. - Wheat shows a decrease of 666,987 bushels while increases are shown in Oats of 687,039 bushels; Barley 66,059 bushels and Rye 16,707 bushels. Flax in store remains the same as previous week. A net increase took place of 102,868 bushels.

U.S. ATLANTIC SEAROARD PORTS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 324,022 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 181,010 bushels; Oats 37,325 bushels and Rye 109,049 bushels, while Barley shows an increase of 3,362 bushels.

DULUTH. - The receipts of bonded grain by rail at Duluth were as follows:- Wheat 7,623 bushels; Oats 9,060 bushels; Barley 772 bushels; Rye 16,707 bushels, a total of 34,162 bushels. The shipments amounted to 87,640 bushels by vessel.






