## CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 11th, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending July 11th, 1924, show a net decrease of 712,986 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 40,113,813 bushels; Oats 21,475,641 bushels; Barley 2,461,546 bushels; Flax 586,979 bushels; and Rye 2,676,265 bushels, a total of 67,314,244 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 550,159 bushels; Oats 122,819 bushels; Barley 9,023 bushels and Flax 143,814 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 112,829 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 3,884,417 bushels from the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 2,770,449 bushels; Oats 860,392 bushels; Barley 123,129 bushels; Flax 56,036 bushels and Rye 73,911 bushels. The total quantity in store was 18,848,427 bushels compared with 22,732,844 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on July 4th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW AND SASKATOON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 51,202 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 27,774 bushels; Oats 22,579 bushels; and Barley 855 bushels. Rye and Flax remained the same as the previous week.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. The stocks of Wheat show an increase of 245,010 bushels over the previous week while Oats decreased 12,249 bushels. Barley and Rye remained the same as the previous week viz., 1,217 and 4,781 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 3,081,414 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 2,504,541 bushels; Oats 282,152 bushels; Barley 168,301 bushels and Rye 203,591 bushels while Flax showed a decrease of 77,171 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease took place in the total grain in store of 1,251 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,263 bushels; Oats 2,890 bushels; Barley 1,994 bushels and Flax 175 bushels; while Rye showed an increase of 5,074 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store decreased by 554,205 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 111,800 bushels; Oats 326,772 bushels; Barley 104,205 bushels; and Flax 11,429 bushels. Rye remained the same as the previous week, viz., 138,268 bushels.

5,528,471 bushels and 233,354 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively during the week. Of the foregoing amounts 4,600,119 bushels and 177,768 bushels was Wheat. The Receipts of the above by classes of Ports were as follows:-

CANADIAN SEABOARD PORTS (MONTREAL AND QUEBEC). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 8,351 bushels. Oats and Barley show decreases of 30,727 and 5,300 bushels respectively while Wheat shows an increase of 27,676 bushels. There was no movement of grain at Canadian Atlantic Seaboard Ports. The Overseas shipments from the above ports (Montreal and Quebec) according to Elevator returns amounted to Wheat 2,750,059 bushels; Oats 244,705 bushels; Barley 153,533 bushels; a total of 3,143,297 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). 3,089,205 bushels of U.S. grain were in store compared with 3,993,671 bushels for the same week last year. The quantities in store by classes of Ports were as follows:-

The shipments of U.S. grain overseas from the Port of Montreal according to elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 199,392 bushels and Rye 94,285 bushels; a total of 293,677 bushels.

U.S. LAKE PORTS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 310,015 bushels. Wheat and Rye showed decreases of 532,876 and 196 bushels respectively while Oats and Barley showed increases of 836,399 bushels and 22,708 bushels making a total increase of 859,107 bushels compared with the total decrease of 599,072 bushels.

**U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.** A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 202,836 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 210,452 bushels and Barley 30,151 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 15,982 bushels and Rye 21,729 bushels.

**DULUTH.** The receipts of bonded grain by rail at Duluth for the week ending July 12th, 1924, were as follows:- Wheat 5,517 bushels; Oats 4,619 bushels; a total of 10,136 bushels. The shipments amounted to 196 bushels of Rye by Rail. For the period from September 1st, 1923, to July 12th, 1924, the Receipts and Shipments were as follows:-


