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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 18th, 1924

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending July 18th, 1924 show a net decrease of 5,267,401 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 36,222,793 bushels; Oats 20,457,825 bushels; Barley 2,173,904 bushels; Flax 560,542 bushels; and Rye 2,631,779 bushels; a total of 62,046,843 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,891,020 bushels; Oats 1,037,815 bushels; Barley 287,642 bushels; Flax 26,477 bushels and Rye 24,486 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 2,622,063 bushels from the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 1,702,103 bushels; Oats 774,657 bushels; Barley 126,536 bushels; Flax 53,120 bushels and Rye 105,847 bushels. The total quantity in store was 16,026,304 bushels compared with 18,648,427 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on July 11th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MONTREAL AND SASKATOON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 44,779 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 17,524 bushels; Oats 25,189 bushels and Barley 1,075 bushels.

VANCOUVER LABOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. The stocks of grain show a decrease in Oats of 59,372 bushels while increases are shown in Wheat of 18,455 bushels and Barley 4,430 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 2,028,611 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 1,573,344 bushels and Oats 767,176 bushels. Increases are shown in Barley of 124,121 bushels; Flax 29,839 bushels and Rye 157,949 bushels.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 18,880 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 9,034 bushels; Oats 7,412 bushels; Barley 4,961 bushels; Flax 254 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 2,751 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 72,466 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 326,152 bushels; Barley 110,924 bushels; Flax 2,902 bushels; and Rye 61,970 bushels while Oats show an increase of 429,082 bushels.

6,550,909 bushels and 202,315 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively during the week. Of the foregoing amounts 4,737,932 bushels and 158,806 bushels were Wheat. The Receipts of the above by classes of Ports were as follows:-

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CANADIAN SEABOARD PORTS (MONTREAL & QUEBEC). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 189,491 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 16,866 bushels while Oats and Barley show increases of 160,283 bushels and 46,074 bushels respectively. There was no movement of grain at St. John, N.B.. The overseas shipments from the above ports (Montreal and Quebec) according to elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 2,493,826 bushels; Oats 169,411 bushels and Barley 170,500 bushels; a total of 2,833,737 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S.GRAIN). 3,462,694 bushels of U. S. grain were in store compared with 3,383,306 bushels for the same week last year. The quantities in store by classes of Ports were as follows:-

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 354,134 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 201,045 bushels; Oats 169,427 bushels and Barley 28,670 bushels while Rye show a decrease of 35,008 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain shows a net decrease of 607,850 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 422,593 bushels; Oats 1,928 bushels; Barley 200,967 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 17,638 bushels.

DULUTH. The receipts of bonded grain at Duluth by Rail for the week ended July 19, 1924, were as follows:- Wheat 12,574 bushels; Oats 12,127 bushels; Barley 6,339 bushels; Rye 4,761 bushels. a total of 35,601 bushels. The shipments were by Vessel and amounted to Wheat 56,825 bushels; Barley 24,189 bushels; Rye 39,769 bushels; a total of 120,783 bushels.






