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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JULY 25th, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending July 25th, 1924 show a net decrease of 3,169,063 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 34,590,368 bushels; Oats 19,159,843 bushels; Barley 2,233,515 bushels; Flax 498,030 bushels and Rye 2,346,019 bushels; a total of 53,877,780 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,632,425 bushels; Oats 1,277,977 bushels; Flax 62,512 bushels and Rye 305,760 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 109,611 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 2,581,106 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,498,270 bushels; Oats 853,719 bushels; Barley 115,395 bushels; Flax 19,991 bushels and Rye 93,731 bushels. The total quantity in store was 13,445,258 bushels compared with 16,026,364 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on July 18th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW AND SASKATOON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 146,558 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 50,209 bushels; Oats 64,673 bushels; Barley 31,341 bushels and Flax 335 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. An increase is shown in the total grain in store of 59,921 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 51,376 bushels; and Oats 8,545 bushels. Barley and Rye remained the same as the previous week.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM & PT. ARTHUR). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,481,003 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,326,539 bushels; Oats 13,294 bushels; Flax 42,186 bushels; and Rye 197,847 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 98,863 bushels. The total grain in store was 26,704,127 bushels compared with 28,205,130 bushels for the previous week.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINALS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 4,191 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 435 bushels; Oats 6,431 bushels; while increases are shown in Barley of 843 bushels and Rye 1,852 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 363,161 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,493,884 bushels; Barley 23,576 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 654,299 bushels.

6,144,168 bushels and 371,991 bushels were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively during the week. Of the foregoing amounts 5,438,533 and 370,174 bushels were wheat. The receipts of the above by classes of ports were as follows:-



CANADIAN SEABOARD PORTS (MONTREAL AND QUEBEC). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 45,322 bushels. Wheat and Barley show increases of 406,723 and 34,826 bushels respectively while Oats show a decrease of 486,871 bushels. There was no movement of grain at St. John, N.B. The overseas returns were as follows:- Wheat 2,322,060 bushels; Oats 452,063 bushels; and Barley 109,022 bushels, a total of 3,883,135 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). 3,416,455 bushels of U. S. grain were in store compared with 3,342,252 bushels an increase of 74,203 bushels. The quantities in store by classes of ports were as follows:-
