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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 1st, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending August 1st, 1924, show a net decrease of 31,561,309 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 31,352,871 bushels; Oats 18,771,425 bushels; Barley 2,046,991 bushels; Flax 483,646 bushels and Rye 2,156,538 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,737,497 bushels; Oats 338,423 bushels; Barley 236,524 bushels; Flax 9,384 bushels and Rye 189,481 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,961,424 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,246,456 bushels; Oats 564,879 bushels; Barley 72,083 bushels; Flax 19,249 bushels and Rye 58,757 bushels. The total quantity in store was 11,483,834 bushels compared with 13,445,258 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on July 25th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW AND SASKATOON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 166,099 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 102,652 bushels; Oats 24,584 bushels; Barley 38,799 bushels and Flax 64 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. An increase is shown in the total grain in store of 227,436 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 223,893 bushels and Oats 3,543 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (PT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 2,254,392 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,836,659 bushels; Oats 420,331 bushels and Rye 123,292 bushels while Barley and Flax show increases of 116,440 and 9,950 bushels respectively. The Total grain in store was 24,469,735 bushels compared with 26,724,127 bushels for the previous week.

WINNIPEG PRIVATE TERMINALS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 21,434 bushels. Oats show an increase of 28,205 bushels and Barley 2,421 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,200 bushels and Rye 5,992 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 844,282 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 918,985 bushels; Oats 11,254 bushels and Rye 2,179 bushels while Barley shows a decrease of 88,136 bushels.

6,021,259 and 7,578 bushels were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively during the week. Of the foregoing amounts 5,040,897 and 7,578 bushels were Wheat. The Receipts of the above by classes of Ports were as follows:-

DULUTH. The Receipts of bonded grain by Rail at Duluth for the week ending July 26th, 1924, were 1,418 bushels of Wheat and the Shipments 46,846 bushels of Wheat.
