CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending October 5th, 1923 show an increase in all grains in store of 11,874,322 bushels over the previous week. The amounts in store for the week were:- Wheat 39,945,550 bushels; Oats 4,961,713 bushels; Barley 3,653,626 bushels; Flax 634,470 bushels; Rye 3,416,177 bushels, a total of 52,591,566 bushels. Increases in each kind of grain were Wheat 9,582,666 bushels; Oats 982,842 bushels; Barley 627,410 bushels; Flax 230,173 bushels; Rye 451,231 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS - The quantities in store show an increase over the previous week of 5,118,944 bushels. The increases were as follows: Wheat 4,224,573 bushels; Oats 571,355 bushels; Barley 152,663 bushels; Flax 74,899 bushels; Rye 95,454 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store in the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces and Western Ontario and British Columbia on September 28th, 1923 with a comparison for the previous week also the same period last year.

THE INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW & CALGARY) Wheat shows an increase over the previous week's storage of 4,585 bushels. Oats and Flax also show increases of 5,339 bushels and 1,311 bushels respectively. The total for all grains was 55,235 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS ELEVATOR. Increases took place in Wheat and Oats of 296,371 bushels. Wheat showed 268,950 bushels and Oats 27,921 bushels.

PUBLIC & PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net increase took place in all grains in store over the previous week of 4385,900 bushels. The increases were as follows: Wheat 3,743,463 bushels; Oats 291,392 bushels; Flax 110,807 bushels; Rye 250,915 bushels. A single decrease took place in Barley of 10,682 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. The stocks show a net increase of 12,762 bushels. A decrease is noted in Wheat of 14,656 bushels and Barley 2,733 bushels while Oats show an increase of 30,151 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The total grain in store shows a net increase over the previous week of 1,557,031 bushels. Oats and Rye showed small decreases of 34,766 bushels and 29,125 bushels. The increases in wheat were 1,244,003 bushels; Barley 313,753 bushels and Flax 43,156 bushels.


The total Receipts of Wheat at the above elevators were 6,045,510 bushels by Vessel and 1,997,287 bushels by Rail. The Vessel receipts are shown at Georgian Bay amounting to 2,935,921 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 2,239,097; St. Lawrence Ports 820,592 bushels. The Rail receipt was shown at the St. Lawrence Ports, viz. Montreal. The total grain receipts amounted to 7,338,072 by Vessel and 2,210,411 bushels by Rail. The former were made up as follows: Georgian Bay Ports 3,212,683 bushels; Lower Lake Ports 2,836,065 bushels and St. Lawrence Ports 1,289,324 bushels. The Rail receipt is credited to St. Lawrence Ports. For detailed statement of Receipts and Shipments see page 7 of the attached.

U.S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The quantity in store was 6,538,707 bushels compared with 8,774,364 last year. The following table shows each kind of grain in store compared with previous year.

U.S. LAKE PORTS (BUFFALO & DULUTH). A net increase is shown of 241,861 bushels in all grains. Oats, Barley and Rye show increases of 93,450; 92,136 and 19,057 bushels respectively, while wheat indicates a decrease of 174,123 bushels.

U.S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. Increases are shown in Wheat of 241,861 bushels; Barley 82,263 bushels; and Rye 126,393 bushels. A single decrease took place in Oats of 2,000 bushels, making a net increase of 448,522 bushels.

DULUTH. The receipts of bonded grain amounted to 416,293 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 44,838 bushels; Oats 15,870 bushels; Rye 9,032 bushels and Barley 27,836 bushels. The Shipments were Wheat 24,576 bushels and Barley 51,000 bushels, a total of 75,576 bushels. The Receipts for the period from September 1st, to October 5th were as follows: Wheat 247,415 bushels; Barley 98,917 bushels; Rye 41,326 bushels; Oats 28,635 bushels, a total of 416,293 bushels. The Shipments were Wheat 133,246 bushels; Barley 51,000 bushels; Rye 46,000 bushels, a total of 230,246 bushels.



SUMMARY OF FLOUR MILL OPERATIONS 1922-23

With the completion of figures covering the operations of flour mills during the month of August, a survey covering the whole of the grindings of the crop of 1922 is of interest. The table below shows, by months, the quantities of wheat ground, wheat flour produced, and wheat flour exported, with total figures for the crop years 1922-23 and 1921-22. The total quantity of wheat ground during 1922-23 mounted to 82,432,290 bushels with a production of 18,797,578 barrels of wheat flour. 11,069,054 barrels of wheat flour were exported. Corresponding figures for the crop year 1921-22 show 69,530,356 bushels of wheat ground, 15,527,310 bushels of flour produced of which 7,378,589 barrels were exported.
