CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 12TH, 1923

Returns received by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending October 12th, 1923 show a net increase in all grain in store of 14,388,827 bushels over the previous week. The amounts in store for the week were: Wheat 53,245,363 bushels; Oats 5,624,048 bushels; Barley 3,398,842 bushels; Flax 832,458 bushels; Rye 3,329,082 bushels, making a total of 66,980,393 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 13,299,813 bushels; Oats 662,905 bushels; Flax 247,988 bushels; Rye 412,905 bushels. A single decrease is shown in Farley of 234,784 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The quantities in store show increases in all grains of 6,473,030 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 5,399,129 bushels; Oats 350,896 bushels; Barley 72,973 bushels; Flax 101,931 bushels; Rye 48,051 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store in the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces and Western Ontario and British Columbia on October 5th, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week, also the same period last year.

THE INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW & CALGARY). The quantity in store shows an increase in all grains of 132,798 bushels made up as follows:

Wheat 118,731 bushels; Oats 10,342 bushels; Barley 1,580 bushels; Rye 2,145 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. Wheat showed an increase of 479,517 bushels while Oats showed a decrease of 23,644 bushels over the previous week. A net increase is, therefore, shown in all grains of 450,873 bushels.

PUBLIC & PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM & FT. ARTHUR). A net increase took place in all grains of 2,979,328 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 2,823,521 bushels; Oats 94,258 bushels; Flax 116,712 bushels; Rye 254,511 bushels; while a decrease is shown of 309,174 bushels in Barley.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. The stocks in these elevators show a net decrease of 24,333 bushels. Wheat showed 27,533 bushels; Barley 261 bushels and Rye 6,120 bushels, while an increase is shown in Oats of 9,581 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. A net increase is shown of 2,730,415 bushels in all grains. Wheat accounted for the majority of this, viz. 2,724,466 bushels. Oats, Barley and Flax showed 110,545, 56,299 and 29,295 bushels respectively. Rye decreased 190,030 bushels.

The bulk of wheat Vessel receipts arrived at Georgian Bay Ports the amount being 4,637,732 bushels; Lower Lake Ports accounted for 1,420,917 bushels and St. Lawrence Ports showed only 678,761 bushels. The Rail receipt was shown at the latter ports amounting to 2,720,196 bushels. The total wheat receipts at the above elevators amounted to 6,737,410 bushels by Water and 2,720,196 bushels by Rail. The total grain receipts amounted to 7,690,640 bushels by Vessel and 2,767,004 bushels by Rail. Of the former total 5,046,428 bushels were received at Georgian Bay Ports: 1,674,195 bushels at Lower Lake Ports and 970,017 at St. Lawrence Ports. The Rail receipt amounted to 2,767,004 bushels and was received at the latter ports.

U.S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The quantity in store amounted to 6,321,853 bushels compared with 8,493,221 bushels for the same week last year. The largest part of this grain is in store at the St. Lawrence Ports (Montreal and Quebec) the amount being 4,785,300 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS (BUFFALO & DULUTH). The stocks show a net increase of 697,981 bushels. Wheat accounts for 582,167 bushels; Oats 116,327 bushels; and Rye 4,078 bushels. A single decrease is noted in Barley of 4,591 bushels.

U.S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. Increases are shown in Wheat of 699,815 bushels and Rye 300,330 bushels. Small decreases are shown in Oats of 300 bushels and 51,610 bushels in Barley.


