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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING October 19, 1923

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending October 19th, 1923 show that the stocks of grain in store increased over the previous week by 11,340,567 bushels. The amounts in store for the week were: Wheat 62,206,221 bushels; Oats 6,986,040 bushels; Barley 5,824,178 bushels; Flax 1,207,398 bushels; Rye 4,097,123 bushels; making a total of 78,320,960 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat 8,960,858 bushels; Oats 1,361,392 bushels; Barley 425,336 bushels; Flax 324,940 bushels; and Rye 268,041 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The quantities in store show increases in all grains of 5,562,233 bushels, made up as follows: Wheat 4,039,726 bushels; Oats 1,088,262 bushels; Barley 157,255 bushels; Flax 225,900 bushels; Rye 51,900 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store in the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on October 12th, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week, also the same period last year.

THE INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW AND CALGARY). A net increase took place in all grains of 149,009 bushels. The increase took place in wheat of 161,126 bushels, while decreases were shown in Oats of 11,615 bushels and Barley 503 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. The amount in store showed a net increase of 52,909 bushels. Wheat increased 53,838 bushels and Oats decreased 929 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FORT WILLIAM & PORT ARTHUR). The stocks in store show an increase of 4,252,537 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 3,380,802 bushels; Oats 363,712 bushels; Barley 204,033 bushels; Flax 86,844 bushels; Rye 217,141 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. The stocks show an increase in all grains of 14,012 bushels. Wheat showed 5,504; Oats 6,796 and Barley 1,612 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. A net increase is shown in all grains of 896,111 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat, Oats, Barley and Flax, and are as follows: 632,247; 106,672; 243,800; and 12,195 bushels respectively. A single decrease is noted in Rye of 98,803 bushels.

The bulk of the Wheat was received at the Georgian Bay Ports amounting to 3,911,426 bushels by Vessel. Lower Lake Ports Receipts amounted to 2,147,685 bushels and St. Lawrence Ports received 897,968 bushels by Vessel and 2,732,860 bushels by Rail. This makes a total of 6,957,079 bushels by Vessel and 2,732,860 by Rail. Of the total grain receipts at the above elevators Georgian Bay Ports received by Vessel 4,322,868 bushels and Lower Lake Ports 2,263,438 bushels. St. Lawrence Ports received 1,445,500 bushels and 2,934,878 bushels by Vessel and Rail respectively. The total grain receipts amounted to 8,031,806 bushels and 2,934,878 bushels.

U. S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The quantity in store amounted to 5,609,086 bushels compared with 8,603,459 bushels for the same week last year. As in the previous week the largest quantity of this grain is in store at the St. Lawrence Ports (Montreal and Quebec) amounting to 4,519,122 bushels, while only 1,180,098 bushels were in store at Georgian Bay Ports. Some 4,916,446 bushels were in store at the Georgian Bay Ports last year and some 3,321,703 bushels at the St. Lawrence Ports. For details see page 8 of the attached grain statistics.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net increase is shown of the quantity in store of 177,455 bushels from the previous week. The decreases took place in Oats of 191,806 bushels and Barley 353,718 bushels while Wheat showed a large increase of 693,350 bushels and Rye 9,639 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A decrease took place in Wheat of 5,835 bushels. Increases are shown in the other grains of 242,126 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 300 bushels; Barley 152,352 bushels; Rye 88,974 bushels; a net increase of 236,291 bushels.

DULUTH. The receipts of bonded grain for the week ending October 19th, 1923 were: Wheat 13,244 bushels; Barley 8,603 bushels; Rye 2,678 bushels; Oats 2,181 bushels; a total of 26,766 bushels. The shipments for the week were Barley 61,657 bushels and Oats 36,171 bushels, making a total of 97,828 bushels.

For the period from September 1st to October 19th, 1923 the Receipts amounted to Wheat 290,466 bushels; Barley 128,420 bushels; Rye 48,082 bushels; Oats 52,147 bushels; a total of 519,115 bushels. The Shipments were Wheat 133,246 bushels; Barley 112,657 bushels; Rye 46,000 bushels; Oats 36,171 bushels; a total of 328,074 bushels.
