CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING October 26th, 1923

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ended October 26th, 1923, show that the stocks of grain in store increased 14,373,568 bushels. The amounts in store for the week were as follows: Wheat 74,234,950 bushels, Oats 6,521,309 bushels, Barley 4,305,702 bushels, Flax 1,543,973 bushels, Rye 4,293,614 bushels, a total of 92,699,523 bushels. The increases took place in Wheat of 12,023,709 bushels; Oats 1,335,269 bushels; Barley 481,524 bushels; Flax 336,575 bushels; Rye 196,491 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. Increases are shown in the quantities in store over the previous week of 6,375,264 bushels in all grains made up as follows: Wheat 5,204,524 bushels; Oats 327,426 bushels; Barley 52,082 bushels; Flax 224,155 bushels; Rye 57,077 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces and Western Ontario and B. C. on October 19, 1923, with a comparison for the previous week, also the same period last year.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (Saskatoon, Moose Jaw and Calgary) A net increase is shown in all grains of 100,036 bushels. The increases took place in wheat, oats, barley and Rye of 90,712; 6,732; 4,403 and 693 bushels respectively, while a single decrease is noted in flax of 2,504 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS ELEVATOR - Wheat shows a decrease of 15,918 bushels, oats increased 199 bushels and Rye 1,666 bushels. A net decrease 14,053 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (Fort William & Pt. Arthur) - The amount in store shows a net increase of 4,253,966 bushels. The increases took place in wheat of 3,836,259 bushels; Barley 92,864 bushels; Flax 158,708 bushels and Rye 186,897 bushels while oats shows the only decrease of 27,762 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS. Decreases are shown in all grains of 22,879 bushels; made up as follows: Wheat 4,396 bushels; Oats 17,118 bushels and Barley 1,365 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. A net increase is shown in all grains of 1,929,715 bushels. The increases took place in wheat of 1,467,081 bushels; Oats 446,331 bushels; Barley 104,642 bushels; while the decreases are noted in Flax of 43,784 bushels and Rye 44,555 bushels.

The bulk of the wheat was received at the Georgian Bay Ports, the amount being 4,051,163 bushels. The Lower Lake Ports; 1,622,759 bushels and St. Lawrence Ports 1,401,310 bushels, all by Vessel. The Rail Wheat receipts amounted to 2,223,679 bushels at the latter Ports, while the water receipts amounted to 7,075,232 bushels at all ports. Of the total Water receipts Georgian Bay accounted for 4,946,536 bushels, St. Lawrence was next with 1,948,492 bushels and Lower Lake Ports 1,768,595 bushels. A total of 8,663,623 bushels received by Vessel and 2,449,764 bushels by Rail. The latter amount was received at St. Lawrence Ports.

U. S. GRAIN IN THE PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. The quantity in store amounted to 5,353,851 bushels compared with 8,670,943 bushels for the same week last year. Montreal and Quebec have the largest quantity of the above in store, viz. 4,216,099 bushels while Georgian Bay Ports show 1,105,145 bushels and Lower Lake Ports 32,607 bushels. Last year the reverse position took place Georgian Bay Ports had 5,564,123 bushels in Store and Montreal and Quebec 2,798,745 bushels, Lower Lake Ports 303,075 bushels. U. S. LAKE PORTS. Increases took place in all grains of 1,736,377 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 1,500,048 bushels; Oats 91,530 bushels; Barley 137,871 bushels; Rye 6,328 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEAPOARD PORTS. A net increase is shown in all grains of 20,142 bushels. Wheat and Rye show decreases of 50,201 bushels and 11,615 bushels respectively. Oats increased 7,931 bushels and Barley 74,027 bushels.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded Grain for the week October 26th, 1923, were: Wheat 33,229 bushels; Oats 23,651 bushels; Barley 26,445 bushels; Rye 13,289 bushels; a total of 96,614 bushels. The Shipments were Wheat 6,782 bushels.

For the period from September 1 to October 26, 1923, the receipts were: Wheat 323,695 bushels; Barley 154,865 bushels; Rye 61,371 bushels; Oats 75,798 bushels, a total of 615,729 bushels. The shipments were Wheat 140,028 bushels; Barley 112,657 bushels; Rye 46,000 bushels; Oats 36,171 bushels, making a total of 334,856 bushels.
