Rapeseed<sup>1/</sup> Handlings - Crop Year 1959-60

The sharply reduced 1959 crop of rapeseed in Western Canada resulted in very much lighter handlings of this oil seed during the 1959-60 season. Primary marketings through licensed channels at 3.0 million bushels were less than half the volume delivered to country elevators, mills and interior terminals in 1958-59. These inward deliveries added to the 0.2 million (revised) bushels held in storage at the beginning of the year provided for exports of 2.9 million (compared with 5.7 million the year before), domestic crushings of 0.2 million and a final carryover of approximately 0.1 million at July 31, 1960.

Details of the 1959-60 storage and handlings are set out in the tables below.
