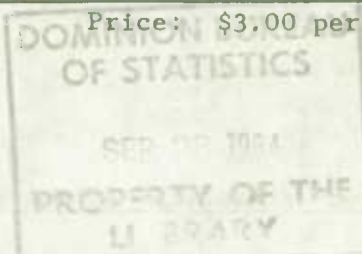

Summary of Preliminary Revised Country Elevator Handlings
and Western Marketings Crop Year 1963-64

Supplementary reports filed by country elevator companies, showing preliminary adjustments to their 1963-64 handlings are incorporated in the tables appearing on this page. These returns reported those receipts and shipments which occurred during the closing days of the past crop year but for which necessary details were not available for inclusion in our regular July 31st release of this bulletin. The adjusted visible supply position gives cognizance to these additional receipt and shipment figures. The data shown below for marketings, shipments and visible supply are still subject to final revision on the basis of the annual returns submitted by the companies. Our experience of the previous season, however, suggests that any further revisions should be of small order. The preliminary data are therefore presented for the convenience of those readers requiring advance information on country elevator operations.
