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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING OCTOBER 17th, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending October 17th, 1924 shows a net increase of 9,037,634 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 40,300,406 bushels; Oats 14,269,513 bushels; Barley 7,421,662 bushels; Flax 650,069 bushels; Rye 2,765,348 bushels; a total of 65,406,998 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 7,036,935 bushels; Oats 489,364 bushels; Barley 1,774,431 bushels; Flax 158,146 bushels while Rye shows a decrease of 421,242 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The grain in store shows an increase of 3,809,549 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 2,677,642 bushels; Oats 346,770 bushels; Barley 623,128 bushels; Flax 115,016 bushels; Rye 46,793 bushels. The total grain in store amounts to 25,846,536 bushels compared with 22,037,187 bushels for the previous week.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATOR (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW AND CALGARY). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 273,924 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 407,326 bushels; Barley 2,013 bushels and Rye 1,241 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 136,656 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. The grain stocks show a net increase of 332,807 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 340,130 bushels while Oats and Rye show decreases of 1,825 and 5,548 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND FT. ARTHUR). There was a net increase of 2,451,735 bushels in the total grain in store. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,946,387 bushels; Oats 622,390 bushels and Flax 43,116 bushels while Barley shows a decrease of 107,246 bushels and Rye 52,912 bushels.

Note (x) Commencing this week Western Ontario and British Columbia will be omitted. The elevators are licensed as either private or manufacturing elevators. The grain handled is our lot grain already accounted for in handlings at Country Elevators in the Prairie provinces.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 6,853 bushels. Increases are shown in wheat of 9,929 bushels, Oats 2,850 bushels and Flax 14 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 4,750 bushels and Rye 1,180 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The grain stocks show a decrease of 150,143 bushels, Wheat and Barley show increases of 57,902 bushels and 292,938 bushels respectively, while Oats and Rye show decreases of 245,718 and 255,265 bushels.

5,097,281 bushels and 1,121,001 bushels of all grain were received during the week at the above elevators by Water and Rail respectively. Of the two amounts 3,529,292 bushels and 659,517 bushels were wheat.

The quantity of grain in store at the St. Lawrence and Seaboard Ports (Montreal, Quebec and St. John) were as follows:- Wheat 1,991,592 bushels; Oats 1,666,011 bushels; Barley 441,495 bushels; Rye 266,390 bushels; a total of 4,365,488 bushels.

The shipments of Canadian grain overseas, according to elevator returns, for the week were as follows:- Wheat 977,069 bushels; Oats 448,712 bushels; Barley 348,483 bushels; Rye 94,998 bushels; a total of 1,869,262 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). A large increase of 8,189,968 bushels is shown in the total U.S. grain in store compared with the same week last year. This increase is made up by the following grains:- Wheat 2,068,950 bushels; Oats 99,580 bushels; Barley 287,838 bushels; Rye 4,674,638 bushels and Corn 1,059,556 bushels.

The shipments of the above grain overseas according to elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 3,576,012 bushels, and Corn 2,412,058 bushels - a total of 5,988,070 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store at these ports of 2,178,110 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,584,905 bushels; Barley 678,955 bushels; Rye 13,743 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 99,493 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net increase of 134,999 bushels. Wheat, Oats and Barley show increases of 12,664, 1,046, 289,403 bushels respectively, while Rye shows a decrease of 168,114 bushels.


