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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 7th, 1924

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 7th, 1924 show an increase of 10,775,974 bushels over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 53,320,913 bushels; Oats 18,363,840 bushels; Barley 10,679,421 bushels; Flax 3,093,552 bushels; Rye 3,537,731 bushels; a total of 94,635,316 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 6,103,944 bushels; Oats 2,265,658 bushels; Barley 821,239 bushels; Flax 1,148,650 bushels; Rye 436,523 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. An increase is shown in the total grain in store of 35,529,727 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 2,361,363 bushels; Oats 614,053 bushels; Barley 245,443 bushels; Flax 396,103 bushels; Rye 57,427 bushels. There was 31,817,333 bushels in store compared with 31,817,333 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on October 31st, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period 1923.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW AND CALGARY). The total grain in store shows an increase of 455,702 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 345,742 bushels; Oats 96,100 bushels; Barley 12,725 bushels; Flax 1,135 bushels.

HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' & PRIVATE ELEVATORS, VANCOUVER, B.C. A net decrease is shown in the stocks of grain in the former elevator of 519,803 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 528,794 bushels while Oats and Barley show increase of 284 and 8,887 bushels respectively. In the latter elevators (private) a net increase is shown of 9,075 bushels. Oats show a decrease of 3,284 bushels while Wheat shows an increase of 12,959 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A large increase is shown in the stocks at the Head of the Lakes of 7,219,114 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 4,695,931 bushels; Oats 1,271,335 bushels; Barley 272,529 bushels; Flax 747,713 bushels; Rye 231,606 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 10,051 bushels. Oats and Barley show decreases of 3,069 and 11,548 bushels respectively, while increases are shown in Wheat of 3,370 bushels; Flax 818 bushels and Rye 398 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The grain in store shows a net increase of 1,035,449 bushels over the previous week. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,300,265 bushels; Oats 255,478 bushels; Barley 86,224 bushels while a decrease is noted in Rye of 12,518 bushels.

6,636,025 bushels and 659,975 bushels were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. Of these amounts 5,469,079 bushels and 327,061 bushels were Wheat.

The Shipments of Canadian grain overseas according to elevators returns for the week were as follows:- Wheat 2,335,163 bushels; Oats 276,154 bushels; Barley 154,310 bushels; Rye 27,152 bushels; a total of 2,792,779 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S.GRAIN). The U.S. grain in store at the above elevators shows a large increase of 8,393,361 bushels over the same week last year. This increase is shown in the following grains:- Wheat 1,777,258 bushels; Oats 898,127 bushels; Barley 326,523 bushels; Rye 3,760,150 bushels and Corn 1,536,303 bushels.

The Shipments from the above elevators overseas of U.S. grain were as follows:- Wheat 4,289,394 bushels; Corn 30,000 bushels; Rye 1,452,691 bushels; a total of 5,752,585 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. Grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,953,907 bushels. Decreases are noted in Wheat of 1,029,527 bushels; Oats 110,797 bushels; Barley 1,757 bushels while Flax shows an increase of 2,801 bushels and Rye 85,323 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net increase is shown in the storage of the grain at the above ports of 227,381 bushels. Increases took place in Oats of 145,538 bushels; Barley 170,746 bushels; Rye 74,287 bushels while Wheat shows a decrease of 163,190 bushels.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonica Grain at Duluth for the week ending November 1, 1924 were Wheat 77,313 bushels; Oats 13,721 bushels; Barley 49,132 bushels; and Rye 10,589 bushels; a total of 150,740 bushels. This was all by Rail. There were no shipments during the week.

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
