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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 21st, 1924

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 21st, 1924, show an increase of 5,329,357 bushels or 5.07% over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 70,405,663 bushels; Oats 21,590,109 bushels; Barley 10,925,226 bushels; Flax 3,896,075 bushels; Rye 3,563,195 bushels; a total of 110,380,268 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 4,540,109 bushels; Oats 567,400 bushels, and Flax 335,039 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 64,805 bushels and Rye 48,436 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The quantity of grain in store shows an increase of 1,540,430 bushels over the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 732,080 bushels; Oats 615,091 bushels; Barley 12,389 bushels; Flax 125,625 bushels and Rye 55,245 bushels. The total stocks in store were 38,915,392 bushels compared with 37,374,962 bushels for the previous week.

X INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW & CALGARY). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 18,831 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats and Barley of 18,644 and 15,222 bushels respectively, while Wheat shows a decrease of 14,263 bushels and Rye 922 bushels.

HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS VANCOUVER, B.C. The stocks in the former elevator show a net decrease of 49,565 bushels from the previous week. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 9,859 bushels, Oats 132 bushels, Barley 41,086 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 1,512 bushels. In the latter elevator a net decrease also took place of 9,388 bushels. Wheat & oats show decreases of 7,245 and 3,385 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 1,242 bushels.

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PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The grain stocks show a net increase of 44,171 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 180,835 bushels; Barley 407,712 bushels; Flax 26,081 bushels, while Oats shows a decrease of 383,815 bushels and Rye 156,942 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,420 bushels. Decreases took place in Oats of 9,625 bushels; Barley 1,543 bushels, Flax 1,969 bushels, while Wheat shows an increase of 11,271 bushels and Rye 4,751 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). A net increase of 2,261,458 in the total grain in store is shown over the previous week. Increases are shown in Wheat of 1,276,823 bushels; Oats 559,873 bushels; Barley 346,047 bushels and Flax 165,372 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 106,657 bushels.

8,374,119 bushels and 654,704 bushels were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. Of these amounts 5,673,610 bushels and 489,636 bushels were Wheat.

The overseas shipments of Canadian grain from the St. Lawrence and Seaboard Ports according to Elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 2,543,521 bushels; Oats 191,760 bushels; Barley 274,879 bushels; Rye 24,000 bushels; a total of 3,034,160 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). The quantity of U. S. grain in store at the above elevators shows a large increase of 638,959 bushels. This increase is shown in the following grains: Wheat 1,600,317 bushels; Oats 1,108,336 bushels; Barley 326,523 bushels; Rye 3,010,213 bushels; Corn 835,661 bushels.

The quantity of U.S. grain shipped overseas according to elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 2,608,982 bushels; Rye 187,422 bushels; a total of 2,796,404 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 548,967 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 2,007,155 bushels, while decreases took place in Oats of 415,022 bushels; Barley 1,010,243 bushels, and Rye 32,918 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store at these ports shows an increase of 975,823 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 363,822 bushels; Oats 175,771 bushels; Barley 205,465 bushels, and Rye 221,275 bushels.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded Grain at Duluth for the week ending November 15th, 1924 were Wheat 45,339 bushels; Oats 6,698 bushels; Barley 18,662 bushels; and Rye 4,748 bushels, a total of 75,447 bushels. This was all by Rail. The shipments were by Vessel and amounted to Wheat 57,000 bushels.
