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## CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 28th, 1924.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending November 23rd, 1924, show a net increase of 8,817,829 bushels or 7.93% over the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 75,112,293 bushels; Oats 24,561,765 bushels; Barley 12,273,147 bushels; Flax 3,574,637 bushels; Rye 3,669,655 bushels; a total of 119,197,497 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 4,706,630 bushels; Oats 2,971,656 bushels; Barley 1,353,921 bushels and Rye 106,460 bushels, while Flax shows a decrease of 321,458 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 273,363 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 571,656 bushels; Barley 142,781 bushels and Rye 1,777 bushels, while decreases are noted in Wheat and Flax of 320,397 and 125,474 bushels respectively. There were 39,188,775 bushels in store compared with 38,915,792 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie provinces on November 21st, 1924, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1923.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. (Saskatoon, Moose Jaw, Calgary and Edmonton). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 157,250 bushels. Wheat and Oats show increases of 67,190 and 92,068 bushels respectively, while Barley and Flax show decreases of 1,251 and 757 bushels.

HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS, VANCOUVER, B.C. The stocks in the former elevator show an increase of 599,715 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 396,680 bushels; Barley 405 bushels and Rye 2,630 bushels. In the latter elevator a net decrease is shown of 8,269 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 11,917 bushels, while increases took place in Oats of 3,252 bushels and Barley 416 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM & PT. ARTHUR). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 1,865,989 bushels. Increases took place in Wheat of 1,406,749 bushels, Oats 510,340 bushels, and Barley 410,382 bushels, while decreases are shown in Flax of 315,559 bushels and Rye 145,032 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). The stocks in store show a net increase of 14,052 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 15,143 bushels and Rye 2,687 bushels, while decreases are noted in Wheat of 2,656 bushels; Barley 957 bushels and Flax 365 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. An increase of 2,275,625 bushels is shown in the total grain in store, made up as follows:- Wheat 336,641 bushels; Oats 1,450,174 bushels; Barley 430,658 bushels and Flax 52,172 bushels.

7,100,386 bushels and 772,296 bushels were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. Of these amounts 3,913,438 bushels and 564,245 bushels were Wheat.

The overseas shipments of Canadian grain from St. Lawrence and Seaboard Ports according to Elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 1,508,141 bushels; Oats 142,361 bushels; Barley 88,402 bushels, a total of 1,738,904 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U. S. GRAIN). The U. S. grain in store shows a large increase of 7,769,381 bushels over the previous week. The foregoing increase is shown in the following grain:- Wheat 1,865,812 bushels; Oats 1,295,964 bushels; Barley 396,502 bushels; Rye 3,050,665 bushels and Corn 1,160,432 bushels.

The quantity of U. S. Grain shipped overseas according to elevator returns were as follows:- Wheat 1,701,403 bushels and Rye 100,191 bushels, a total of 1,801,594 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. An increase took place in the total grain in store of 3,663,233 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 2,953,191 bushels; Oats 149,921 bushels; Barley 503,243 bushels; Flax 62,496 bushels and Rye 14,382 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 176,251 bushels. Oats and Rye show increases of 176,122 and 230,716 bushels respectively, while Wheat and Barley show decreases of 98,851 and 131,736 bushels.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded Grain at Duluth for the week ending November 22nd, 1924 were Wheat 114,715 bushels; Oats 22,277 bushels; Barley 53,155 bushels; and Rye 17,082 bushels, a total of 207,229 bushels. This was all by Rail. The shipments were by Vessel and amounted to Wheat 115,000 bushels; Oats 70,000 bushels, Barley 120,000 bushels and Rye 50,000 bushels, a total of 355,000 bushels.
