CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING January 16th, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 16th, 1925, show a net decrease of 631,011 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 89,238,513 bushels; Oats 30,841,455 bushels; Barley 12,040,740 bushels; Flax 4,711,228 bushels; Rye 4,476,712 bushels; a total of 141,308,648 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 107,654 bushels and Barley 1,336,979 bushels while Oats show an increase of 337,518 bushels; Flax 348,756 bushels and Rye 127,348 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 386,887 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 111,852 bushels; Oats 273,801 bushels; Barley 17,856 bushels while Flax shows a decrease of 10,454 bushels and Rye 6,168 bushels. There were 36,091,071 bushels of grain in store compared with 37,704,184 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on January 9th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW & EDMONTON) 65,628 bushels more grain were in store at the above elevators than the previous week. This increase is shown in the following grains: Wheat 38,569 bushels; Oats 24,503 bushels; Barley 2,556 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 27,102 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats 34,185 bushels; Flax 131 bushels; and Rye 4,553 bushels while Wheat shows a decrease of 3,659 bushels and Barley 62,313 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show an increase of 320,064 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 96,758 bushels; Oats 143,568 bushels; Barley 31,818 bushels; Flaxseed 26,044 bushels and Rye 21,876 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 9,635 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 1,040 bushels while Oats show an increase of 7,563 bushels; Barley 2,447 bushels; Flax 483 bushels and Rye 182 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The grain in store shows a net decrease of 258,770 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 10,397 bushels; Oats 223,688 bushels; Barley 45,302 bushels and also Flax 1,131 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 26,748 bushels.

1,093,863 bushels and 620,247 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively, the former from winter storage afloat. Of these amounts 1,015,507 bushels and 444,390 bushels were Wheat.

The quantity of U.S. grain shipped overseas from Seaboard Ports was: Wheat 88,803 bushels and Rye 60,000 bushels; a total of 148,803 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,422,380 bushels. Wheat and Barley show decrease of 711,666 bushels and 1,092,555 bushels respectively while Oats and Flax show decreases of 48,158 and 333,683 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The stocks at these ports show an net increase of 295,027 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 371,929 bushels; Oats 34,428 bushels and Rye 80,157 bushels while Barley shows a decrease of 191,487 bushels.

DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending January 17th, 1925, were as follows:- Wheat 7,874 bushels; Flaxseed 1,256 bushels; a total of 9,130 bushels. This was all by Rail. There was one shipment during the week of 1,256 bushels of Flax by rail.




