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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING January 23, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 23rd, 1925 show a net increase of 488,327 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 88,575,574 bushels; Oats 30,892,822 bushels; Barley 12,710,504 bushels; Flax 5,105,972 bushels; Rye 4,512,103 bushels; a total of 141,796,975 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 51,367 bushels; Barley 669,764 bushels; Flax 394,744 bushels and Rye 35,391 bushels while Wheat shows a decrease of 662,939 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS - 615,148 bushels more grain were in store this week than the previous week. The increases took place in the following grains:- Wheat 340,968 bushels; Oats 189,542 bushels; Barley 33,898 bushels; Flax 42,483 bushels; Rye 8,257 bushels. There were 38,706,219 bushels in store compared with 38,091,071 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on January 16th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS - (CALGARY, SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW AND EDMONTON).- The grain in store shows an increase of 218,660 bushels over the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 156,854 bushels; Oats 42,432 bushels; Barley 18,332 bushels and Flax 1,042 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL ELEVATORS - A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 199,324 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 208,008 bushels; Oats 3,739 bushels and Barley 1,787 bushels while a decrease is shown in Rye of 14,210 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM & PT. ARTHUR). There are 620,634 bushels more grain in store at the Head of the Lakes than last week made up as follows:- Wheat 391,167 bushels; Oats 105,780 bushels; Barley 48,139 bushels; Flax 50,278 bushels and Rye 25,266 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). Grain in store and afloat shows a net decrease of 1,222,293 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,073,664 bushels; Oats 129,470 bushels; Barley 38,435 bushels; while Rye shows an increase of 19,326 bushels.

407,964 bushels and 597,968 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively, the former from winter storage afloat. Of these amounts 407,964 bushels and 444,026 bushels were Wheat.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS - Decreases are shown in all grain in store of 382,681 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 128,127 bushels; Oats 80,670 bushels; Barley 169,894 bushels; Rye 3,984 bushels.

DULUTH - The Receipts of Bonded Grain at Duluth for the week ending January 24th, 1925, were as follows:- Wheat 11,000 bushels; Oats 6,365 bushels; Barley 3,565 bushels; Rye 1,530 bushels; a total of 22,460 bushels. 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
