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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING JANUARY 30, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending January 30, 1925 show a net decrease of 1,616,772 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 88,198,976 bushels; Oats 31,373,640 bushels; Barley 12,289,016 bushels; Flax 4,821,924 bushels; Rye 3,496,647 bushels; a total of 140,180,203 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 376,598 bushels; Barley 421,488 bushels; Flax 284,048 bushels; and Rye 1,015,456 bushels while Oats show an increase of 480,818 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- The stocks show a net increase of 671,528 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 393,537 bushels; Oats 289,383 bushels; Rye 12,554 bushels while Barley shows a decrease of 13,066 bushels and Flax 10,880 bushels. There was 39,377,747 bushels in store compared with 38,706,219 bushels for the same period last year.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on January 23rd, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATTON, MOOSE JAW AND EDMONTON).- 264,380 bushels more grain were in store this week than the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 208,240 bushels; Oats 45,700 bushels; Barley 9,323 bushels; Flax 1,117 bushels; a total of 264,380 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- An increase is shown in the total grain in store of 487,932 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 404,118 bushels; Oats 44,275 bushels; Barley 37,172 bushels; Rye 2,367 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- The stocks at the Head of the Lakes show an increase of 1,064,558 bushels over the previous week. This increase was made up as follows:- Wheat 548,907 bushels; Oats 208,581 bushels; Barley 214,426 bushels; Flax 57,494 bushels and Rye 35,150 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). - The total grain in store shows a net increase of 1,722 bushels. Increase is shown in Flax of 9,242 bushels while Wheat shows a decrease of 4,354 bushels; Oats 2,345 bushels and Flax 821 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,037,771 bushels. Decreases took place in Wheat of 707,737 bushels; Oats 164,542 bushels; Barley 150,749 bushels; Flax 30,958 bushels while an increase is shown in Rye of 16,215 bushels.

744,682 bushels and 614,484 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively, the former from winter storage afloat. Of these amounts 744,682 bushels and 425,566 bushels were Wheat.

U. S. LAKE PORTS.— A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,718,404 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,173,614 bushels; Barley 269,917 bushels; Flax 300,000 bushels while Oats show an increase of 25,127 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS.— The grain stocks show a net decrease of 1,350,717 bushels. Wheat, Barley and Rye show decreases of 45,695 bushels; 257,919 bushels and 1,081,742 bushels respectively while Oats show an increase of 34,639 bushels.

DULUTH.— The Receipts of Bonded Grain at Duluth for the week ending January 31st 1925, were as follows:- Wheat 6,070 bushels; Oats 2,327 bushels; Barley 2,609 bushels; a total of 11,006 bushels. This was all by Rail. There were no shipments during the week.
