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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 6, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 6th, 1925, show a net decrease of 601,493 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 87,472,644 bushels; Oats 30,849,098 bushels; Barley 12,105,137 bushels; Flax 4,853,536 bushels; Rye 4,198,355 bushels, a total of 139,578,719 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 726,372 bushels; Oats 424,542 bushels and Barley 183,879 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 51,612 bushels and 701,638 bushels respectively.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 189,689 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 245,256 bushels; Barley 47,847 bushels and Flax 17,643 bushels, while Oats and Rye show an increase of 108,091 bushels and 12,936 bushels respectively. There were 39,188,058 bushels in store compared with 39,377,747 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on January 30th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW AND EDMONTON). The grain in store shows a net increase of 202,095 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 164,495 bushels; Oats 23,314 bushels; Barley 14,540 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 254 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL ELEVATORS. - A net increase is shown in the stocks of grain in store of 261,216 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 290,814 bushels and Oats 14,680 bushels, while Barley shows a decrease of 39,904 bushels, and Rye 4,374 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM & PORT ARTHUR). There were 682,345 bushels more grain in store at the Head of the Lakes than the previous week. Increases are shown in Wheat of 294,019 bushels; Oats 175,374 bushels; Barley 151,207 bushels; Flax 48,486 bushels and Rye 15,179 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG).— The total grain in store shows a net increase of 12,689 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 30,255 bushels; Flax 769 bushels and Rye 107 bushels, while Wheat shows a decrease of 6,039 bushels and Barley 12,403 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 835,336 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 759,149 bushels; Oats 100,832 bushels; Barley 38,740 bushels, while Rye shows an increase of 13,375 bushels.

727,424 bushels and 507,640 bushels of grain were received at the above elevators by vessel and rail respectively, the former from winter storage afloat. Of these amounts 727,424 bushels and 385,121 bushels were Wheat.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,092,138 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 494,880 bushels and 605,528 bushels respectively, while Barley and Rye show 6,743 and 1,527 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net increase of 407,335 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 29,544 bushels, and Rye 665,162 bushels, while Oats show a decrease of 69,896 bushels and Barley 217,475 bushels.

DULUTH. - The Receipts of Bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending February 7th 1925, were as follows:- Wheat 25,870 bushels; Barley 2,609 bushels; a total of 11,006 bushels. This was all by rail. There were no shipments during the week.



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
