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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 13th, 1925.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 13th, 1925, show a net increase of 109,743 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 87,220,287 bushels; Oats 31,199,935 bushels; Barley 12,260,739 bushels; Flax 4,795,237 bushels; Rye 4,212,255 bushels; a total of 139,688,453 bushels. Increases are shown in Oats of 250,837 bushels; Barley 155,602 bushels and Rye 13,920 bushels while Wheat shows a decrease of 252,317 bushels and Flax 58,299 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - The stocks show a net decrease of 36,262 bushels from the previous week. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 73,353 bushels; Barley 10,579 bushels; Flax 19,068 bushels while Oats show an increase of 63,600 bushels and Rye 3,138 bushels. There were 39,151,796 bushels in store compared with 39,188,058 bushels for the previous week.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW AND EDMONTON). - The stocks of grain show a net increase of 79,043 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 26,544 bushels; Oats 38,165 bushels; Barley 15,895 bushels; while Flax shows a decrease of 1,564 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 228,750 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 207,919 bushels; Barley 28,433 bushels; and Rye 1,599 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 9,201 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). - All grains show an increase of 1,473,077 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 241,423 bushels; Oats 304,804 bushels; Barley 240,036 bushels; Flax 63,861 bushels and Rye 22,956 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG.). The total grain in store shows a net increase of 15,493 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 16,996 bushels; Rye 2,574 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 385 bushels; Barley 2,164 bushels and Flax 1,528 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,035,045 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 943,377 bushels and Barley 296,126 bushels while Oats and Rye show increases of 136,023 and 20,435 bushels respectively.

974,655 bushels and 621,683 bushels were received at the above ports by Vessel and Rail respectively; the former from winter storage afloat. Of these amounts 340,483 bushels and 519,405 bushels were Wheat.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S.GRAIN). 7,520,639 bushels more grain were in store this year than for the same period last year. This increase is shown in the following grains:- Wheat 1,857,956 bushels; Oats 1,710,343 bushels; Barley 334,594 bushels; Rye 3,844,558 bushels and Corn 1,097,189 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. - A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 91,374 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,495 bushels; Oats 103,345 bushels; Flax 100,000 bushels while Barley and Rye show increases of 112,306 and 1,160 bushels respectively.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 475,939 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 326,971 bushels; Oats 178,824 bushels; Rye 37,942 bushels while Barley showed an increase of 67,798 bushels.

DULUTH. The Receipts of bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending February 14th 1925 were as follows:- Wheat 16,030 bushels; Barley 8,354 bushels; Rye 1,160 bushels; a total of 25,544 bushels. This was all by rail. There were no shipments during the week.


