CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 20th, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 20th, 1925, show a net decrease of 1,635,398 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 35,303,941 bushels; Oats 31,638,017 bushels; Barley 12,115,547 bushels; Flax 4,853,402 bushels; Rye 4,141,648 bushels, a total of 133,052,555 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,916,346 bushels; Barley 145,192 bushels and Rye 70,607 bushels, while Oats show an increase of 438,082 bushels, and Flax 58,165 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The stocks for the week show a net decrease of 90,991 bushels. Wheat, Barley and Flax show a total decrease of 166,036 bushels made up as follows: 75,117, 76,510 and 14,749 bushels respectively. Oats show an increase of 68,281 bushels and Rye 6,764 bushels. There were 39,060,805 bushels in store compared with 39,151,796 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on February 13th, 1925 with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, SASKATOON, MOOSE JAW & EDMONTON) A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 78,307 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 61,663 bushels; Barley 21,410 bushels and Flax 1,101 bushels, while Oats and Rye show decreases of 4,801 bushels and 1,066 bushels respectively.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL & PRIVATE ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a net increase of 226,922 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 206,383 bushels; Oats 13,421 bushels and Barley 17,244 bushels, while Rye shows a decrease of 10,126 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). 1,394,357 bushels more grain are in store at the Head of the Lakes than the previous week. This increase is shown in the following grains: Wheat 709,264 bushels; Oats 374,315 bushels; Barley 206,644 bushels; Flax 69,161 bushels and Rye 34,973 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 8,984 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 14,174 bushels; Oats 7,387 bushels and Rye 2,580 bushels while Barley and Flax show increases of 12,905 and 2,252 bushels respectively.

This increase is shown in the following grains:- Wheat 1,093,552 bushels; Oats 1,706,359 bushels; Barley 334,534 bushels; Rye 2,935,030 bushels and Corn 977,025 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The stocks of grain show a net decrease of 651,037 bushels. Decreases are shown in wheat of 514,403 bushels; Barley 40,471 bushels and Rye 97,236 bushels while Oats show an increase of 1,073 bushels.

DULUTH. The receipts of bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending February 21st, 1925 were as follows:- Wheat 11,175 bushels; Barley 3,363 bushels; a total of 14,538 bushels. This was all by Rail. There were no shipments during the week.
