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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 22nd, 1924

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending August 22nd, 1924, shows a net decrease of 1,516,176 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 23,585,894 bushels; Oats 16,719,118 bushels; Barley 1,192,857 bushels; Flax 302,091 bushels; Rye 1,954,473 bushels; a total of 43,754,438 bushels compared with 45,269,614 bushels for the previous week. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,880,765 bushels; Barley 107,771 bushels and Rye 92 bushels while Oats show an increase of 462,630 bushels and Flax 10,822 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 579,650 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 486,538 bushels; Oats 53,540 bushels; Barley 22,471 bushels; Flax 6,088 bushels and Rye 11,013 bushels. The total quantity in store amounted to 7,362,522 bushels compared with 7,942,172 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia on August 15th, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period 1923.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (C. LIGRAY, MOOSE JAW AND SASKATOON). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 73,759 bushels. Oats and Barley show decreases of 64,342 bushels and 209 bushels respectively, while Wheat shows an increase of 10,706 bushels, Flax 249 bushels and Rye 247 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. The total grain in store shows an increase of 127,484 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 97,562 bushels; Oats 27,654 bushels and Barley 2,268 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,604,186 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,419,640 bushels; Barley 224,557 bushels; Flax 32,642 bushels and Rye 7,480 bushels while Oats show an increase of 80,133 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows an increase of 974,038 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 244,414 bushels; Oats 587,404 bushels; Barley 92,914 bushels and Flax 49,303 bushels.

2,925,373 bushels of Wheat were received at the above elevators by Vessel during the week. The total grain received amounted to 4,266,973 bushels by Vessel and 16,250 bushels by Rail. The receipts of the above by classes of ports were as follows:-

CANADIAN SEABOARD PORTS. (MONTREAL AND QUEBEC). The total grain in store shows an increase of 1,012,600 bushels over the previous week made up as follows:- Wheat 518,819 bushels; Oats 354,564 bushels; Barley 94,914 bushels and Flax 49,303 bushels.

The Shipments of Canadian grain overseas were as follows:- Wheat 921,160 bushels; Oats 18,823 bushels; Barley 43,016 bushels; a total of 933,299 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST. (U.S. GRAIN). 3,854,895 bushels of U. S. grain were in store compared with 5,025,747 bushels for the same period 1923, a decrease of 1,170,852 bushels. The quantities in store by classes of ports were as follows:-

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 2,208 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 29,616 and 28,337 bushels respectively while Barley and Rye show increases of 44,286 and 16,532 bushels respectively.
