CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING FEBRUARY 27th, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending February 27th, 1925, show a net decrease of 722,035 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 33,924,154 bushels; Oats 31,969,592 bushels; Barley 12,336,567 bushels; Flax 4,909,367 bushels and Rye 4,190,530 bushels, a total of 137,330,520 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 1,379,777 bushels, while increases are shown in Oats of 331,875 bushels; Barley 221,020 bushels; Flax 55,965 bushels and Rye 48,832 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - The stocks for the week show a net decrease of 206,223 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 304,367 bushels; Barley 103,061 bushels and Rye 22,861 bushels. Oats show an increase of 215,080 bushels and Flax 3,986 bushels. There were 38,854,582 bushels in store compared with 39,060,805 bushels for the previous week.



U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 769,683 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 669,023 and 164,375 bushels respectively, while Barley shows an increase of 63,715 bushels.

U. S. Atlantic Seaboard Ports. The stocks of grain show a net decrease of 108,024 bushels. The decreases are shown in Wheat of 106,910 bushels and Oats 25,843 bushels, while Barley and Rye show increases of 9,248 and 15,481 bushels respectively.

DULUTH. The receipts of bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending February 28th, 1925 were as follows:- Wheat 15,135 bushels; Barley 1,235 bushels; and Oats 2,299 bushels, a total of 18,669 bushels. This was all by Rail. There were no shipments during the week.

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
