CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 13th, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 13th, 1925 show a net decrease of 1,966,889 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 80,994,156 bushels; Oats 32,405,534 bushels; Barley 11,988,048 bushels; Flax 4,753,893 bushels; Rye 4,059,984 bushels; a total of 134,201,615 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,948,626 bushels; Barley 156,235 bushels; Rye 13,345 bushels; while Oats show an increase of 109,648 bushels and Flax 41,669 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 1,161,684 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,007,772 bushels; Oats 41,038 bushels; Barley 52,411 bushels; Flax 37,825 bushels and Rye 22,638 bushels.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on March 6th, 1925 with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 97,449 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 75,895 bushels; Oats 19,998 bushels; Barley 1,556 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 191,460 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 164,204 bushels; Oats 27,229 bushels; Barley 454 bushels while Flax shows an increase of 427 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 2,772,543 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,817,718 bushels; Oats 617,649 bushels; Barley 220,569 bushels; Flax 79,067 bushels; and Rye 37,540 bushels. There were 51,061,583 bushels in store at the Head of the Lakes compared with 48,289,040 bushels for the previous week.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (WINNIPEG). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,208 bushels. Oats and Rye show decreases of 8,450 and 591 bushels respectively while Wheat and Barley show increases of 3,351 and 4,432 bushels.


