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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MARCH 27th, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending March 27th, 1925, show a net decrease of 2,038,119 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 79,078,637 bushels; Oats 31,831,969 bushels; Barley 11,571,231 bushels; Flax 4,817,004 bushels; Rye 3,795,057 bushels; a total of 131,093,398 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,665,640 bushels; Oats 260,841 bushels and Rye 237,359 bushels while increases are shown in Barley of 103,608 bushels and Flax 22,113 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - The total grain in store shows a decrease of 1,627,474 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 809,915 bushels; Oats 587,736 bushels; Barley 168,965 bushels; Flax 33,353 bushels and Rye 27,455 bushels. There were 33,872,500 bushels in store compared with 35,499,974 bushels in store for the previous week.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 79,046 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 61,301 and 17,803 bushels respectively while Barley shows an increase of 58 bushels only.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. A decrease is shown in the total stocks in store of 325,453 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 288,768 bushels; Oats 7,650 bushels; Barley 29,033 bushels and Flax 22 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). An increase is shown in the total grain in store of 2,693,141 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,533,352 bushels; Oats 511,521 bushels; Barley 260,652 bushels; Flax 55,466 bushels and Rye 37,138 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,595,673 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 1,616,241 bushels while Oats show an increase of 13,900 bushels; Barley 5,140 bushels; Flax 20 bushels and Rye 1,510 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 61,244 bushels. Oats and Barley show increases of 86,132 bushels and 325,482 bushels respectively while Wheat shows a decrease of 103,724 bushels and Rye 247,846 bushels.

DULUTH. The receipt of bonded grain at Duluth for the week ending March 28th, 1925, were as follows:- Wheat 19,942 bushels; Oats 6,385 bushels; Barley 5,140 bushels and Rye 1,510 bushels; a total of 32,977 bushels. There were no shipments during the week.


