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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 3rd, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 3rd 1925 show a net decrease of 6,167,817 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 74,276,317 bushels; Oats 31,098,649 bushels; Barley 11,277,498 bushels; Flax 4,773,479 bushels; Rye 3,500,138 bushels, a total of 124,926,061 bushels. Decreases are shown as follows: Wheat 4,802,320 bushels; Oats 733,320 bushels; Barley 293,733 bushels; Flax 43,525 bushels and rye 294,919 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. - The total grain in store shows a decrease of 2,390,472 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 1,261,447 bushels; Oats 870,439 bushels; Barley 166,544 bushels; Flax 43,261 bushels and Rye 48,781 bushels. There were 31,482,028 bushels in store compared with 33,872,500 bushels for the previous week.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 362,901 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 343,871 bushels; Oats 38,248 bushels; and Barley 1,897 bushels, while Flax shows an increase of 1,125 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the stocks in store of 545,196 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 545,653 bushels and Barley 2 bushels only, while an increase is shown in Oats of 459 bushels.
