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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 10th, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 10th, 1925, show a decrease of 5,094,852 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 70,792,282 bushels; Oats 29,943,579 bushels; Barley 10,840,622 bushels; Flax 4,632,087 bushels; Rye 3,572,659 bushels; a total of 119,831,229 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 3,484,035 bushels; Oats 1,155,070 bushels; Barley 436,876 bushels; Flax 91,392 bushels while an increase is shown in Rye of 72,521 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS.- A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 2,525,475 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,421,554 bushels; Oats 809,807 bushels; Barley 197,698 bushels; Flax 109,361 bushels and Rye 47,055 bushels. There were 28,896,553 bushels in store compared with 31,482,028 bushels last week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on April 3rd, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 139,854 bushels. Wheat shows a decrease of 67,125 bushels; Oats 67,042 bushels; Barley 5,776 bushels while Flax shows an increase of 89 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- The total grain in store shows a decrease of 133,228 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 87,261 bushels; Oats 42,190 bushels and Barley 3,777 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR).- The grain stocks at the Head of the Lakes show an increase of 1,353,310 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 904,704 bushels; Oats 314,329 bushels; Barley 92,179 bushels; Flax 17,598 bushels and Rye 24,500 bushels.
