CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING APRIL 17th, 1925

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending April 17th, 1925, show a decrease of 8,189,830 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows: Wheat 65,327,553 bushels; Oats 28,061,348 bushels; Barley 10,476,712 bushels; Flax 4,610,355 bushels; Rye 3,165,431 bushels; a total of 111,641,399 bushels. Decreases are as follows: Wheat 5,464,729 bushels; Oats 1,882,231 bushels; Barley 363,910 bushels; Flax 71,732 bushels, and Rye 407,228 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 2,658,069 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 1,469,866 bushels; Oats 842,889 bushels; Barley 217,149 bushels; Flax 96,825 bushels and Rye 31,339 bushels. There were 26,238,484 bushels in store compared with 28,896,553 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on April 10th, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW, SASKATOON AND EDMONTON). A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 316,235 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 210,952 bushels; Oats 101,183 bushels; Barley 3,635 bushels and Flax 465 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 969,260 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 926,177 bushels; Oats 56,615 bushels; Barley 6,462 bushels and Flax 6 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 1,437,181 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 838,350 bushels; Oats 556,552 bushels and Barley 51,322 bushels, while Flax and Rye show increases of 46,076 and 12,977 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U.S. GRAIN). There were 6,108,858 bushels more grain in store at the above elevators than the same week last year. This increase is shown in the following grains: Wheat 794,328 bushels; Oats 1,642,044 bushels; Barley 140,632 bushels; Rye 2,598,002 bushels and Corn 933,852 bushels.


