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CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 1st, 1925.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 1st, 1925, show a decrease of 5,336,787 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 56,875,913 bushels; Oats 24,194,455 bushels; Barley 7,825,145 bushels; Flax 3,469,767 bushels and Rye 2,980,555 bushels, a total of 95,345,835 bushels. Decreases are shown in all grains and were as follows:- Wheat 2,754,672 bushels; Oats 950,522 bushels; Barley 998,227 bushels; Flax 395,536 bushels; and Rye 237,830 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A decrease is shown in all grains of 2,868,689 bushels, made up as follows:- Wheat 1,814,045 bushels; Oats 618,115 bushels; Barley 261,775 bushels; Flax 141,874 bushels and Rye 32,880 bushels. There was 20,415,137 bushels in store compared with 23,283,826 bushels for the previous week.



INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 443,107 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 316,074 bushels; Oats 98,421 bushels; Barley 29,522 bushels while Flax shows an increase of 90 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS. A net increase is shown in total grain in store of 11,116 bushels. Wheat shows an increase of 20,895 bushels while Oats and Barley show decreases of 7,338 and 2,441 bushels respectively.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 3,584,003 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,842,306 bushels; Oats 1,080,032 bushels; Barley 485,433 bushels and Flax 255,132 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 79,500 bushels.




