## CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING AUGUST 29th, 1924.

Returns showing stocks of grain in store at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the week ending August 29th, 1924, shows a net decrease of 5,505,202 bushels. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 19,442,525 bushels; Oats 15,248,032 bushels; Barley 1,210,410 bushels; Flax 206,524 bushels; Rye 2,141,945 bushels; a total of 38,249,236 bushels compared with 43,754,438 bushels for the previous week. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 4,142,569 bushels; Oats 1,471,086; Flax 95,567 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 17,553 bushels and Rye 187,467 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 280,491 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 250,582 bushels; Oats 106,894 bushels; Barley 19,191 bushels and Flax 5,915 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 102,091 bushels. The total quantity in store amounted to 7,082,051 bushels compared with 7,362,522 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces, Western Ontario and British Columbia, on August 22nd, 1924, with a comparison for the previous week and the same period 1923.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS (CALGARY, MOOSE JAW & MASTERTON). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 14,849 bushels. Oats show a decrease of 15,271 bushels while Wheat has increased 422 bushels.

VANCOUVER HARBOUR COMMISSIONERS' ELEVATOR. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 569,544 bushels made up as follows: Wheat 369,222 bushels and Oats 332 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 2,174,461 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 2,227,622 bushels; Oats 436,149 bushels; Barley 76,749 bushels and Flax 33,832 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 44,891 bushels.

PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS, (WINNIPEG). A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 33,277 bushels. Wheat, Oats and Barley showing decreases of 1,578; 31,704; and 991 bushels respectively while Rye shows an increase of 1,056 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (CANADIAN GRAIN). The total grain in store shows a net decrease of 1,039,547 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 1,316,722 bushels and Oats 404,817 bushels while Barley shows an increase of 17,312 and Rye 64,680 bushels.

2,302,365 bushels and 131,037 bushels of grain were received at the <sup>above</sup> elevators by Vessel and Rail respectively. Of this amount 1,850,455 bushels and 104,624 bushels were Wheat.

CANADIAN SEABOARD PORTS (MONTREAL AND QUEBEC). The stocks at the foregoing ports shows a net decrease of 196,050 bushels from the previous week. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 159,057 bushels; Oats 20,495 bushels and Barley 9,153 bushels while Rye shows an increase of 23,555 bushels.

The Shipments of Canadian grain overseas were as follows:- Wheat 1,106,948 bushels; Oats 65,882 bushels; and Barley 99,635 bushels; a total of 1,272,515 bushels.

PUBLIC ELEVATORS IN THE EAST (U. S. GRAIN). 4,926,703 bushels of U. S. grain were in store at the above elevators for the week compared with 5,135,665 bushels for the same week last year. This shows a decrease of 208,962 bushels. The quantities in store by classes of ports were as follows:-

The Shipments of U. S. grain overseas from the Ports of Montreal and Quebec were Wheat 1,456,875 bushels.

U. S. LAKE PORTS. A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 176,093 bushels. Oats and Flax show decreases of 471,823 and 55,820 bushels respectively, while Wheat shows an increase of 242,090 bushels; Barley 102,597 bushels and Rye 6,863 bushels.

U. S. ATLANTIC SEABOARD PORTS. The total grain in store shows a decrease of 216,930 bushels from the previous week. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 220,355 bushels; Barley 5,425 bushels and Rye 37,114 bushels while Oats show an increase of 45,964 bushels.



DULUTH. The Receipts of Bonded Grain at Duluth for the week ending August 30th, 1924, were 1,779 bushels of Barley and 6,367 bushels of Rye by Rail. There were no shipments for the period from September 1st, 1923 to August 30th, 1924 the Receipts and Shipments were as follows:-




