CANADIAN GRAIN STATISTICS - WEEK ENDING MAY 3th, 1925.

Returns received at the Dominion Bureau of Statistics showing stocks of grain in store for the week ending May 3th, 1925, show a net decrease of 3,545,191 bushels from the previous week. The stocks for the week were as follows:- Wheat 56,279,711 bushels; Oats 22,294,570 bushels; Barley 7,134,809 bushels; Flax 3,074,637 bushels; Rye 2,966,917 bushels; a total of 91,800,644 bushels. Decreases are shown in Wheat of 596,202 bushels; Oats 1,899,885 bushels; Barley 640,336 bushels; Flax 395,130 bushels and Rye 13,638 bushels.

WESTERN COUNTRY ELEVATORS. A decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 2,827,927 bushels made up as follows:- Wheat 1,813,201 bushels; Oats 608,613 bushels; Barley 234,214 bushels; Flax 91,506 bushels; Flax 80,393 bushels. There were 17,587,210 bushels in store compared with 20,415,137 bushels for the previous week.

The following table shows the quantities of grain in store at the Country Elevators in each of the Prairie Provinces on May 1st, 1925, with comparison for the previous week and the same period 1924.

INTERIOR TERMINAL ELEVATORS.- A net decrease is shown in the total grain in store of 235,798 bushels. Wheat and Oats show decreases of 207,811 bushels and 30,297 bushels respectively while Barley shows an increase of 2,310 bushels.

VANCOUVER TERMINAL AND PRIVATE ELEVATORS.- A net increase is shown in the total grain in store of 372,757 bushels. Increases are shown in Wheat of 379,949 bushels and Barley 3,094 bushels while Oats show a decrease of 10,286 bushels.

PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TERMINAL ELEVATORS (FT. WILLIAM AND PT. ARTHUR). The total grain shows a net decrease of 80,641 bushels. Decreases are shown in Oats of 1,172,832 bushels; Barley 396,382 bushels and Flax 329,493 bushels while Wheat shows an increase of 1,815,431 bushels and Rye 2,334 bushels.
